This parish is 2½ miles long, 1½ miles broad, and contains3,203 statute acres. The surface consists in general of good land, and is traversed by the road from Rathkeale to Newcastle.

The property of Butler Clarke, Esq., containing 264 acres. The Mail Coach Road from Limerick to Eralee passes by its eastern boundary as far as Reens Turnpike, and from thence by a road leading to the Village of Ardagh. This td. is all in tillage and pasture. Part of its western boundary is subject to floods.

The property of Thomas Studdert, Esq., containing 244 acres. The Mail Coach road from Limerick to Tralee passes by its northern and western boundaries. This td. is all in tillage and pasture. A large portion in its south-eastern side is subject to floods. Acreable rent -£1 10s.

In the south-eastern extremity of the parish. Bounded on the N. by the tds. of Kilscannel and Reens West; N.E. by Rathkeale Ph.; E. and S. by Grange Ph. and by Ballyrobin Td.

The property of De Courcy O'Grady, Esq., under the Earl of Devon. Contains 806 acres. The Mail Coach road from Limerick to Tralee passes through this td. from its northern to its southern extremity. A road from Knockaderry to Ardagh crosses the above road. The whole of this td. is in tillage and pasture. Its northern and northwestern boundary is subject to floods. Acreable rent - £1 15s.

A road leading from Rathkeale to Ardagh cuts off an angle to the S.E. and then continues along the southern boundary of the td. in a westerly direction for a considerable distance. The entire td. is under tillage and pasture. Acreable rent - $\pounds 2$.

Part of this td. is near the centre of the parish. Bounded on the N. by the Ph. of Clonagh and the Glebe of Kilscannel; E. by the td. of Reens East; S.E. by the td. of Reens West; S. by Coolanoran and Ballyrobin Tds.; and W. by Ardagh Ph. and the Tds. of Skehanagh and Coolybrown.

The property of Lady O'Brien, containing 617 acres. All under tillage and pasture. A considerable portion is subject to floods. Part of its northern boundary is a road leading from Rathkeale to Ardagh, from which a bye-road branches off in a S.W. direction, passing by Kilscannel Church, and from there winds westerly until it joins the Rathkeale and Ardagh Road.

In the eastern part of the parish. Bounded on the E. by Rathkeale Ph.; N. by Ballinlyny Td.; and S. and W. by the Td. of Reens E.

The property of Lord Southwell, containing 271 acres. The whole of this td. is under tillage and pasture. The Mail Coach road from Limerick to Tralee passes along its northern and western boundaries. A bye-road branches from the northern portion of the above road in a southerly direction, passes the Village of Killeheen, and then winds southwesterly and joins the road on the western boundary of the td. A considerable portion of this td. along its scuth-eastern boundary is flooded in winter. Acreable rent - $\pounds 1$.

The property of Sir Lucius O'Brien, containing 168 acrea, all in tillage and pasture. A considerable portion along its S. and W. boundaries is subject to floods. This td. is also called Reens Upper. Acreable rent - \pounds 1 10s. The Mail Coach road from Limerick to Tralee passes along its western boundary for a considerable distance, then crosses the td. and takes a portion of its western boundary for some distance.

This td. is situated about 3 miles west of Rathkeale. It is bounded on the N.W., N. and N.E. by Kilscannel Td.; E. by the td. of Reens E.; and S. and S.W. by Coolanoran Td.

The property of Sir Lucius O'Brien, containing 170 acres, all in tillage and pasture. A considerable portion is subject to floods. This td. is also called Reens Lower. Acreable rent - \pounds 1 10s. The Mail Coach

It is the property of I. Studdert, Esq., under Lord Southwell. A road from Rathkeale to Ardagh passes through this townland, and a bye-road branches from and later rejoins this main road. Acreable rent - $\pounds 2$ 4s.
