Bounded on the N. by the phs. of Hospital, Kilfrush & Emly; W. by the phs. of Enockainy, Athneasy and Emlygrennan; E. by the phs. of Ballyscaddan and Galbally; and S. by the ph. of Glenbrohaun.

Knocklong Ph. (contd.)

Contains 4,442 acres, statute measure. This parish is all arable land, well cultivated and beautifully interspersed with neat country houses. There are roads bearing in all directions, several ancient forts, and a few moats. There are 2 burying grounds, one in the td. of Knocklong East; the other, called Clogheen, is in the td. of Ballynahinch.

This townland is situated in the south of the parish. It is bounded on the N. by Doonmoon and Hammondstown Tds.; W. by the tds. of Knocktoran and Balline; E. by the td. of Island Dromagh; and S. by Ballinvreena Td.

Is the property of Richard Oliver Gascoigne, Esq., and contains 953 acres, all arable land. In the north of the td. there is a graveyard. called Cloheen. In the S. stand the ruins of Ballynahinch Castle. There are roads in all directions through the td. Several small streams and one large river traverse the td. There is one Trigl. Point 393 feet above the sea level. There are several neat houses interspersed.

The road leading from Kilmallock to Hospital and Emly forms the northern boundary, and another road forms the southern boundary, of this td.

In the N.E. of the parish. Bounded on the N. by the tds. of Ballincarroona and Ballinvreena; W. by the td. of Knocklong East; E. by the tds. of Ballyhoolahan & Scarteen; and S. by Raheen Td.

Is the property of Peter Law, Esq., Dublin, and contains 332 acres. All is arable land with the exception of a small portion of rough pasture. Nearly central in the td. is one road bearing S.E. and N.W. There are 2 ancient forts in the td., and several neat houses are interspersed.

Central of the parish. Bounded on the N. by the td. of Knocklong East; W. by Ballynahinch Td.; E. by the tds. of Mitchelstown Down North and Island Dromagh; and S. by Ballynahinch Td.

Is the property of Mr. Goold, Cork, and contains 69 acres. There is one small portion of rough pasturage in the South; the remainder of the td. is arable land. About the centre of the td. there is a spring well, and there are a few houses towards the north boundary. There is no road in the td.; but it is separated from the tds. of Island Dromagh and Mitchelstown Down N. by a stream. The name of the well is Toberedmond.

Is the property of George Gubbins, Milltown, and contains 109 acres, all arable land. In the east of the td. there is a small pond of water, and in the N. is a fort. This td. is divided from Glenbrohaun Ph. by a river called Cavernaneashagh or Morning Star.

In the S.W. of the parish. Bounded on the N. by Elton Td.; W. by the tds. of Ballinvana and Darranstown; E. by the tds. of Doonmoon and Ballynahinch; and S. by Balline Td.

Is the property of Captain Wells, Templemore, and contains 405 acres. All is arable land, with the exception of two small portions of rough pasture in the centre. Also, about the centre, there is a cross roads, to the north of which stands an ancient fort, called Knocktoran. In the N. of the td., on the parish boundary, there is a neat village, called Elton Cross.

Knocktoran = Cnoc Teorann, the hill of the boundary.

In the N. of the parish. Bounded on the N. by the tds. of Ballincarroona and Knocklong E.; S. by the tds. of Ballycahil and Elton; and E. and S. by the td. of Knocklong East.

Is the property of -- Cooper, Esq., Dublin and Sligo, and contains 702 acres, all arable land. There is one road bearing E. and W. through the td., about the centre. There are 6 forts in the td., standing in a direct line N. and S. There are several neat houses interspersed. In the S.E. of the td., adjacent to a road, stands Knocklong Chapel.

In the north of the parish. Bounded on the N. by Ballincarroona Td.; W. by the tds. of Knocklong West and Ballynahinch; E. by the tds. of Grange and Raheen; and S. by the tds. of Hammondstown and Mitchelstown Down North.

Is the property of -- Cooper, Esq., Dublin & Sligo, & contains 560 acres, all arable land. There are 2 roads bearing nearly E. and W. through the td., one south, the other about the centre. East of the central road stands Knocklong village. Between the two roads stand St. Patrick's and St. Paul's wells, Knocklong Castle (in ruins) and Knocklong Church ruins and graveyard. In the N. of the td. there is a large fort. In the N.W., on the boundary with Knocklong West, is a cross of 5 roads, named Knocklong Cross.

Is the property of Sir David Roche, Carass, and contains 277 acres, all arable land. There are several houses interspersed throughout this td. About its centre there is a marsh. There is no road in the td.

In the south of the parish. Bounded on the N. by the td. of Mitchelstown Down North; W. by Island Dromagh Td.; E. by the tds. of Raheen and Mitchelstown East; and S. by the tds. of Glenlary and Clohast.

Is the property of John Cleary, Esq., Absentee, and contains 277 acres, all arable land. In the S.E. of the td. there is a neat house with a garden and orchard . A few more houses are interspersed. The first-mentioned house is called Mitchelstown Down Cottage. A road from Garryspellane village runs through the td., terminating about Edmund's Well. Nothing of antiquity.

In the S.E. of the parish. Bounded on the N. by Raheen Td.; W. by the td. of Mitchelstown Down West; E. by Raheen Td.; and S. by the tds. of Ballyfroota and Mitchelstown Down West.

Is the property of -- St. George, Esq., Absentee, and contains 145 acres, all arable. A few houses are interspersed throughout the td. Aughavoona Bridge marks the ph. boundary. The eastern boundary of the td. is the centre of the road leading to Ballylanders, and the road from Garryspellane village forms its northern boundary.

Raheen (contd.)

Is the property of J. B. Massy, Ballywire, and contains 397¹/₂ acres, all arable land. In the N. of the td. there is a road, bearing E. and W., with several houses on both sides of it. There are 5 moats in the td. There is a Trigl. Station erected on one of the moats, being near the E. boundary, and is called Knockaunatarriff. There is one fort in the S. of the td., called raheennamadra. Adjacent to the E. boundary stands Garryspellane village.
