(3) Earl Mount Alexander. This was Hugh Montgomery, 2nd Viscount Montgomery, who forfeited his estates in England as a Royalist, but, on the Restoration was created Earl of Mount Alexander, and had his English estates restored and got large grants in Ireland. He married a daughter of the 1st Earl of Drogheda and left issue. The title became extinct in 1757 on the death of the 5th Earl.

(4) Henry O'Brien, 7th Earl of Thomond, inherited, with the Clare estates, considerable ancestral estates in the County Limerick. His grandson, Henry, 8th Earl, died without issue in 1741, and was buried in Limerick Cathedral. By his will the great Thomond estates were left to Murrough, Lord O'Brien, son and heir of the Earl of Inchiquin, with remainder to Percy Wyndham, Lady Thomond's nephew, who succeeded to the estates in 1756, when he was created Baron Ibrackan and Earl of Thomond. He died unmarried in 1774, when these estates went to his nephew, the 3rd Earl of Egremont. The patrimony of the O'Brien's of Thomond is now vested in Charles Henry Wyndham, 3rd Baron Leconfield.
