We are informed that a new Pipe Water Company
is about to be formed. The Ballysimon wells afford
an abundant supply of water, which has been analysed
by Mr. St. Pierre Foley and a medical gentleman, and
proved to be very superior for all purposes of both
human and domestic consumption. From those wells
the city of Limerick will be supplied with a pure and
wholesome spring water. The new company will be
enabled to reduce the charges to one-half the present
standard, and it is confidently hoped the inhabitants
will warmly support an undertaking which promises
to confer such incalculable benefits on the community.
The present company are under the necessity of
forcing the water from the Shannon at Plassey to their
tank at Garryowen, which puts them to a considerable
annual outlay, two engines of 50 horse power each
being employed for the purpose. The Ballysimon
wells have been surveyed, and are 17 feet higher than
the tank—thus saving all expense in that department.
Swansea is also supplied with water from springs,
within two miles of the town, and which, like the
