MANUFACTURE OF CARBON DIOXIDE.

Comparatively little has been beileildug concerning the production of this industrially important gas, associated in the popular mind comething with the soda fountain, although over 100,000,000lb. of liquid carbon dioxide produced annually in America. Coal brooks is burnt under steam boilers, boilers, producing simultaneously power required for purification and liquefaction, and flue gases from which the gas is obtained.
