Grain, in general, continues its price according to last quotations, but tho' the supply is not deficient, it is not so great as was observable during the close of the last week, particularly of wheat, prime samples of which still bring 29s. and, progressively in quality, downwards to 24s.

Barley, of which there is an abundance coming in, keeps, and rather looks up, 28s. being given for best description, and 26s. 6d. may be quoted as a good average.

Oats are stationary in price, from 18s. down to 13s.  
The provision market may now be quoted for the first time, as the heavy cattle are only beginning to come in. Six and a quarter (ox) beef is at 30s. Four and halvea, 25s. and four and quarter 23.  
Pork of which there is but a scanty supply in, 25s.
