Bunual on Prices.

Sitting in Limerick.

Monday's Proceedings.

The Prices of Meat.

Tribunal on Prices, consisting of S. L. Browne, K.C.; Professor Mr M. Roddy, T.D., and Mr T. F. Fe, resumed the Limerick sittings in City Courthouse this morning. Mr Barry, victualler, Upper William Street, in his evidence stated there were up to twenty butchers in Limerick. There is a master victuallers' association in the city and consequently there was no regular prices. He purchased in various ways at the monthly fair and at the cattle auction. There was no public sale in Limerick, and he killed from one to two beasts a week, and from three to five sheep. He paid £3 10s. a week for a butcher, and also kept a helper. He is now paying 80s. per cwt. dead weight for cattle, or 8½d. per lb., and sold at prices varying from 1s. to 6d. per lb. At last his prices were—beef, 1s. 4d. for sirloin stakes; ribs, 1s. 2d. per lb., for quarter cuts, shoulders, 10d.; corned beef, 9d. and 9d.; neck pieces, 8d. and shank fourpence to fivepence. These prices since the same period were—beef, 1s 4d per lb.; shoulders, 1s 2d; ribs, 1s; neck, 10d and 1s. This was since then an all-round reduction of twopence a pound. The "fall" in the price of cattle and sheep realized from 25s to 20s.

Mr Roddy, the witness said that he had a contract at the City Home, the price of beef being 7½d per lb. Mr Roddy—That is greatly below what is large to the ordinary purchasing

Mr Kelly, victualler, Nelson street, in his weekly killings were two head of cattle and from ten to twelve sheep. The price of cattle was 55s. and 57s. 6d. for live weight for best quality, and the best sent price was 45s. per cwt. There was a heavy fall in the price of sheep within a month. His price for sirloin joints was 1s. 4d. per lb.; rib joints, 1s. 4d.; and shoulder from 10d. to 8d.; corned

CO. CORK MURDER.

Tailor Shot Dead.

A shocking crime, which is believed to be the outcome of agrarian trouble, occurred at Ballyrobin, Churchtown, Co. Cork, on Sunday night, when Edward Donovan, a tailor, was shot dead at about 8.30 o'clock while standing on the street.

His son, aged about 16, ran to the village of Cloyne, some miles away, and told the Civic Guard there that his father had been fired at and wounded. When Dr Murphy, of Cloyne, went to Ballyrobin he found that the man was dead.

It is believed that he was fired at from behind a ditch opposite his house. Two or three shots were heard, and he was struck in the head.

Donovan was an inoffensive man, and lived in a thatched cottage, where he had his tailoring shop. He owned about half an acre of land at the rear of the house.

Detectives from Cork are investigating the matter.
