The Margaret, Yesev, regular trader, which sailed from this port, for London, on the 29th ult. with Wheat, oats; butter, and feathers, has not since been heard of, and it is feared she is lost with all her crew. The following is her cargo:—1,240 brls. oats, 40 brls. wheat, 402 firkins butter, J. & J. M'Namara—400 firkins butter, J. Edwards—206 firkins butter, T. Ryan—200 firkins butter, J. & P. M'Donnell—10 bags feathers, M. Minehan—8 bags feathers, J. O'Neill.

The Three Brothers of Dungarvan, Fitzgerald, is lost on the Welch coast.

The Catherine, Swan, has sailed from London for this port.

The Anacreon, of Cardigan, Jones, bound to Cork, is ashore on the Goodwin sands, Fishguard, and bilged.

The Thomas and Jane, Colman, of and for Cork, from Glasgow, is ashore at the entrance of Wexford harbour—crew saved.

The Marys, Primrose, from this port, has arrived at Glasgow.

The Jane, Collins, has cleared out at Glasgow for this port; and the Trader, Castles, has sailed from Glasgow for this port.

The Good Intent, Oates, from Plymouth to Penzance, was upset in a heavy squall, on the 20th instant, off Ram-head, when a woman, her child and a boy were drowned.

The Lady Queen Williams, from Youghal to Portsmouth, was driven ashore near Hartland Point, Bideford, on the 20th instant, and it is feared vessel and cargo will be lost.

The Clitus, Hanton, from this port has arrived at Liverpool; also, the Janet, M'Alister.

Claims of salvage on the hull, cargo and materials of the Providence, of Quebec, wrecked at Feinett, Tralee Bay, are now hearing at the Custom House of that port.
