This parish is situated about 5 miles S.E. of the City of Limerick. It is bounded on the E. by the phs. of Inch St. Lawrence and Caherconlish; N. by Carrigparson and Cahernarry phs.; W. by Cahernarry ph.; and S. by the

phs. of Rochestown and Caherelly. It contains 1,954 acres.

It is about 2 miles long and one mile broad, with a hilly surface. Its principal roads are: - one, which bounds part of it on the west side, leading from Limerick to Cork; and another from Croom to Caherconlish, leading E. by W. through its north end.

Situated at the centre of the west boundary of the parish, and/contains 455 acres. It is bounded on the E. by the tds. of Luddenbeg and Kilculleen; N. and W. by the ph. of Cahernarry; and S. by the tds. of Stonepark and Luddenmore.

It is arable and without limestone. Soil light and partly gravelly, producing potatoes, corn and flax. The proprietor John Croker and Henry O'Grady Esqrs. The former has part let to 3 tenants at will and at £2 10s. per acre; and the latter to 3 other tenants by leases of one life at £2 15s. per acre. Co. This is cobelisk, about 21 ft. high and 8 ft. in diameter, termating in a point. It was built in 1827 by the proprietorino. Eelly, Esq. It is placed on the summit of a high Al, from which is an extensive view. On this hill, while the workmen were digging for stone, &c., they turned up quantity of human bones so numerous that they quitted dring there.
