The nearest part of this parish is distant 2 miles from the town of Rewcastle and is in the south of Co. Limerick. It is bounded on the K. by the the of Grange and Clonelty; E. by the phs. of Clonelty, Milmeedy. Cloneagh and Drumoullaher; S. by the phs. of Drumoullaher, Killagholehane and Kilmeedy; and W. by the phs. of Killeedy and Monagay.

This parish contains 12,687 acres, and is in a state of high cultivation, having but very little box and rough pasture interspersed through it. It contains a small village in the north of the parish, called Mahoonagh, and another in the south thereof, colled Peohanagh. There are, also, a few Gentlemen's seats. The river Deel runs through it, as do also the road leading from Newcastle to Drumcullaher and six bye-roads abutting therefroe.
