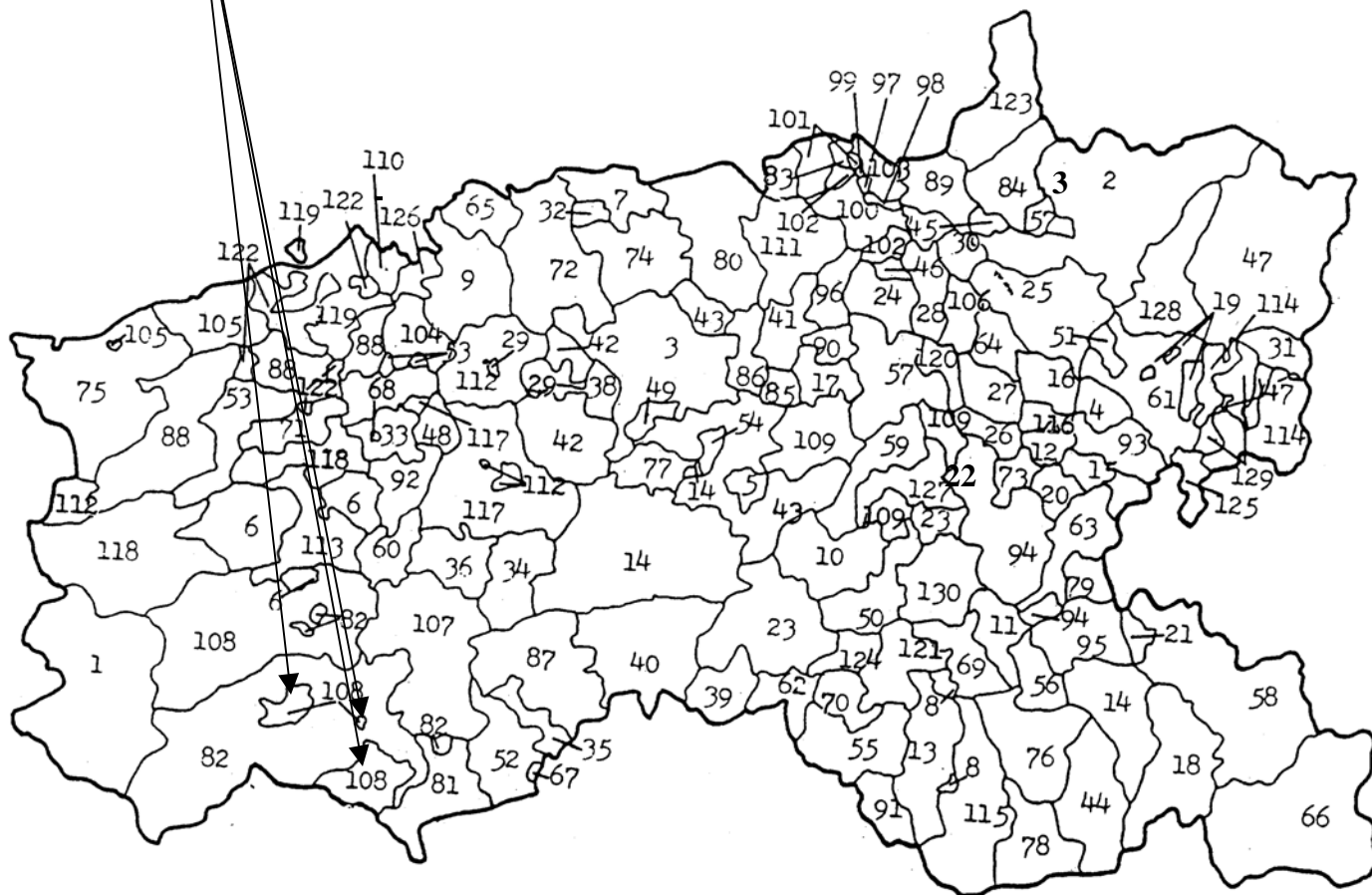

This parish is situated near the S.W. extremity of the County of Limerick, nearly 20 Irish miles from the City of Limerick and S.W. of it. It is bounded on the S. by Killeedy Ph.; E. by Abbeyfeale Ph.; N. by the phs. of Abbeyfeale, Ardagh and Newcastle; and E. by Mahoonagh Ph.

Part of the town of Newcastle stands on its northern boundary. The road from Newcastle to Abbeyfeale passes through it. About  $\frac{1}{2}$  the surface is under tillage; the remainder is mountainous, boggy and uncultivated land. The greater portion of the parish belongs to the Earl of Devon. Portions of the parish are detached.
