DEATHS.

At Beechmount, county Tipperary, on the 29th ult. Thomas Godfrey Phillips, Esq. JP, aged 47 years, beloved in life and lamented in death, by his affectionate wife, relatives, and friends. Impressed from early years with the importance of religious principle and moral duties, in his intercourse with mankind, he made it equally a study and pleasure to sustain in his person the true character of both, by uniform observance of their mutual obligations. Consequently his functions as a country gentleman moved in harmony with those of a just magistrate and good neighbour, so that Mr. Phillips was universally esteemed for his honourable discharge of those duties. The lingering illness with which it had pleased Almighty Providence to afflict him, but served to elicit those amiable traits of a loving nature which can be appreciated best in the tender endearments of private life. 'Faith, hope, and charity' inspired him to the last moment with edifying resignation and perfect confidence in the everlasting Gospel, which teacheth that Charity is the greatest of Christian virtues. The Protestant Orphan society, at every annual meeting, was sure to enlist the warmest sympathies of his active and generous patronage. "To visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction, to keep himself unspotted from the world," an injunction he ever responded to obey, was illustrated on his dying bed. While rejoicing in the happy fruits of the Limerick Orphan Bazaar, just conveyed to him, and blessing God that he was mercifully spared to know it, his peaceful spirit took flight to "glorify the Father which is in Heaven."

On Saturday last, at Dromcolloher, in this county, aged 86, William Thomas Hayes, one of the oldest inhabitants in that locality, father of the Sub-Inspector of Constabulary at Edenderry. He was the only lineal male descendant known of the ancient family of that name who were of distinction in the reign of James the 1st, at Cloncrew and its vicinity, and who were allied to the "Powers," chiefs of Kilbolane castle, in that locality, who forfeited during the Commonwealth. Mr. Hayes's remains were followed to the ancient family burial place, Cloncrew, by a large concourse of persons on Monday last, amongst whom were several of the Roman Catholic clergy, who performed the last solemn rites over the body of deceased.
