Dublin, October 27, 1786. GIVE me leave to acquaint you that I have been in France, Flanders, and Holland, and found that this was the proper feafon for tranfplanting the plants of Rape Seed that was fowed in the month of July or August last, about this time the farmer vifits his crop of Rape, and where he finds they are too thick fown he draws the plants, and puts them in another part of the field where they will have more room to grow; others will transplant this Rape into wheat fallow, about a foot diftance from each other; one stalk of Rupe fet in this manner, will produce near double what is fowed otherwise, those who are strangers to this way of raising Rape Seed are requested to
