THE LIMERICK NATIONAL ACADEMY OF SCIENCE AND MECHANICS.

A select and highly respectable Meeting of the EMPLOYERS and OPERATIVES of this City assembled at the GYMNASIUM, Catherine-place, on Tuesday, the 10th inst. on the motion of Mr. Henry Owens,

JAMES PAINE, Esq. being called to the Chair, the following Resolutions were unanimously agreed to:—

Proposed by Mr. John Fogarty, and seconded by Mr. Henry Owens:—"Resolved, that the Establishment of a Seminary, such as proposed by the plan of the National Academy of Limerick, is a subject that demands our serious consideration and liberal support.

Proposed by Mr. Thomas Ryan, and seconded by Mr. Joseph Seymour:—"Resolved, that this meeting fully approve of the plan and Prospectus submitted to them, for establishing a National Academy in our City, and pledge themselves to give it their warmest support, and that the Committee do have power vested in them to revise the plan.

Proposed by Mr. P. O'Conner, and seconded by Mr. William Wallace:—"Resolved, that, in accordance with the foregoing Resolutions, a Seminary, to be called the "National Academy of Limerick," be established in this City.

Proposed by Mr. Patrick M'Donnell, and seconded by Mr. Denis O'Keeffe:—"Resolved, that a Committee of this Meeting, with power to add to their number, be appointed to receive subscriptions and adopt measures, for carrying the foregoing Resolutions into effect, and that five of said Committee form a quorum.

Proposed by Mr. Henry Owens, and seconded by Mr. Pierce Creagh:—"Resolved, that subscriptions be now entered into to defray the expenses of the outfit, &c. and that the gentry and landed proprietors of the County and City be respectfully requested to lend their assistance.

Proposed by Mr. Patrick M'Donnell, and seconded by Mr. Denis O'Keeffe:—"Resolved, that any Gentleman who may be appointed on the Committee, and shall absent himself on four different occasions, after being duly noticed, without due cause for such absence, shall cease to be a member of said Committee.

Proposed by Mr. Henry Owens, and seconded by Mr. Joseph Seymour:—"Resolved, that a vote of thanks be now given to the Provisional Committee for their exertions in the formation of this Institution.
