large congregation, and the Bishop and  
Canon officiated. The two minutes' silence  
was reverentially observed.

A special service was held at Ennis  
Church this afternoon, the preacher  
being the Rev. H. MacManway, M.C.

## CITY CINEMA HOUSES.

### Opposition to Sunday Opening.

The Public Health Committee had under  
consideration at a meeting last night the  
application of the City Exhibitors' Associa-  
tion to have their cinema licenses extended  
to Sundays. A deputation from the  
Association put the views why the  
application should be granted before the  
meeting, and instanced centres where  
cinema houses were opened on Sundays.  
The application was opposed by the Rev.  
Father O'Dwyer, P.P., St. Munchin's, and  
other of the city clergy—Rev. Father  
Hannan, Adm., St. Michael's, and Rev. Father  
McNamara, Adm., St. John's. Father  
O'Dwyer stated that in 1909 the Corporation  
gave an undertaking to the late Bishop, Most  
Rev. Dr. O'Dwyer, not to grant a license for  
Sunday cinema performances, and he hoped  
the present Council would not violate that  
contract.

It was decided to adjourn the question to  
next meeting.
