CITY FATALITY.

DOCK WORKER KILLED.

An accident, which had a fatal termina- tion, occurred at the docks last evening, when John Murphy, aged 28, and married, lost his life. It appears that deceased, with others, was engaged in unloading the steamer "Peer Gynt" at the north side of the dock basin for the contractors of the Shannon Power Scheme. They were in the act of swinging from the ship by means of the derrick a heavy plank when the chain snapped, with the result that the beam fell on Murphy, fracturing the spinal column. Having been medically and spiritually at- tended to he was removed to Barrington's Hospital, but succumbed before he reached the institution. Deceased was an ex-Captain of the National Army, and brother of ex-Brigadier-General T. Murphy.

Inquest Opened.

An inquest was opened in Barrington's Hospital this evening by Coroner McNeice and a jury into the circumstances under which deceased met his death.

Inspector Kenny represented the authori- ties, and evidence of identification was given by Timothy Murphy, brother of the deceased, who was he said employed as a docker by Siemens Bauunion. He was 29 years of age, and married.

Dr. W. P. Dundon, House Surgeon, Barrington's Hospital, deposed to making a post-mortem on the body of deceased, who had a fracture of the breast and rupture of the veins at the base of the heart. He died from shock and hemorrhage caused by these injuries.

On the application of the Inspector, the enquiry was adjourned till 6 o'clock to- morrow evening to enable the Civic Guards to complete their enquiries.
