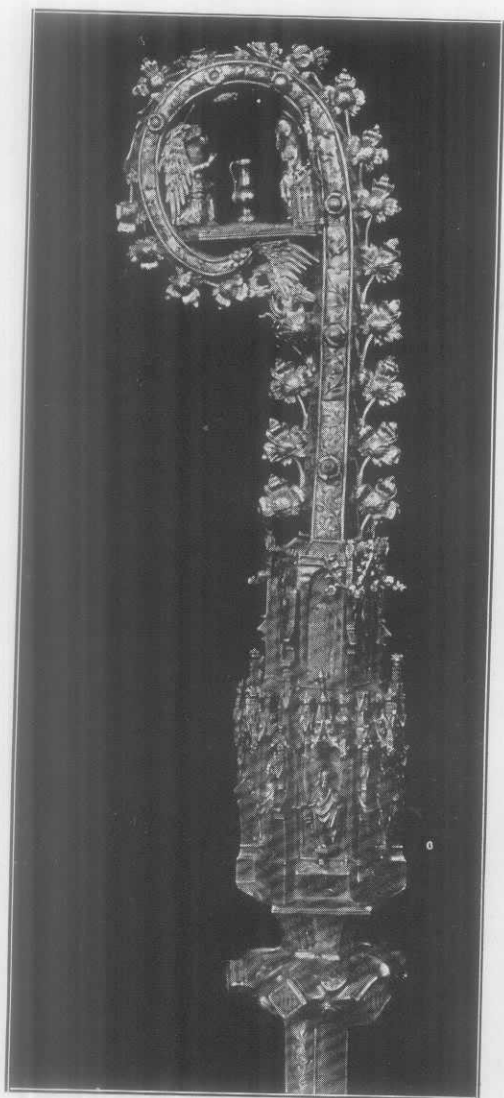

ANNUAL MEETING.

The Sixth Annual Meeting and Conversazione was held in the Athenæum, on Tuesday evening, 10th January, 1899.

The President (Dr. W. A. Fogerty), in opening the proceedings, welcomed those present to the meeting which showed a marked advance on the exhibition of last year. In the report, they would see what the Committee had done ; it was a great privilege to have such a Club, and such a Society to come to week after week to hear something of the world about them. They had arranged for regular meetings for the entire Winter, and the programme was a very interesting one. They

had some difficulty in getting people to help, whereas they should be overwhelmed with offers to conduct the evening meetings, and it was hoped this would be the way in future. The membership was about 300, and the Committee should have less difficulties in their way.

Mr. Neale read the Report as follows:—It is again the pleasant duty of your Committee to report that the Club continues in a flourishing condition, as far at least as its membership is concerned; also, that the interest in its meetings has very decidedly increased during the year. The scarcity of working members continues to be a matter for regret, but it is reasonable to hope that these will increase as a natural result of the progress of the Club.

Botanical and Entomological research continue to occupy the positions held by these subjects six years ago. Many additional specimens have been placed in the Club *Herbarium* during the year, in addition to which a private collection has been made, chiefly representing some of the more peculiar forms occurring in County Kerry.

To the *fauna* of the district has been added a rather remarkable beetle—*Silpha quadripunctata*—two examples of which were taken on Whit-Monday, 30th May, in Cratloe Wood. It has only before been reported in Ireland from Wicklow and Carlow, and does not appear to be a common insect anywhere. Its habits are abnormal, almost all its relatives being ground or carrion feeders, whilst it has forsaken this diet and taken to live in trees where it preys upon living *lepidopterous* and other *larvæ*. The Irish Burnet Moth *Zygena pilosella* var. *nubigena*, was taken in abundance beside Killone Lake, County Clare, on June 23rd, on which date an excursion took place to New Hall and Killone Abbey. This is one of the very few insects to be found in Ireland, but not in England. In Ireland it occurs only in the west and is very local.

The Photographic Section of the Club has done good work during the year, as will be shown here this evening in the lantern and on the walls. It has also undertaken one most useful piece of organized work, viz.—to illustrate two Lectures by Rev. James Dowd, B.A., on "Historic Limerick," for one of which, already delivered, on "St. Mary's Cathedral," about 70 lantern slides were specially made, adding much to the interest of the subject handled.

During the year Archæology has continued to provide interesting papers for the Winter meetings, to the illustration of which the

Photographic Section has been of the greatest assistance, as in connection with the lectures on "Historic Limerick," already spoken of. Much useful work should be done by the Club in encouraging the study of History and Archæology, and it is particularly desirable that members should note any items of local tradition, folklore, etc., which may come to their knowledge, with a view to having them recorded in the **CLUB JOURNAL**, and so saved from complete oblivion. During the next session it is probable that a course of lectures will be arranged on these subjects, with a view to create and deepen a taste for them amongst our members. The Committee have to express regret for the loss of the services of Mr. J. Grene Barry, J.P., during the greater portion of the year as Honorary Secretary of the Section.

Some good photographs have been secured of the ruins of Holy Cross Abbey, and also of those on the Rock of Cashel, besides numerous views of County Kerry monuments, etc., these latter being intended to illustrate a lecture to be delivered by one of our members on the 31st instant.

It affords your Committee much pleasure to report the very successful delivery of a course of geological lectures during November and December last by Mr. J. Fitzgerald Windle, Assoc. M. Inst. C.E., and a Vice-President of the Club. About forty members entered for the course, the attendance throughout being very good, averaging over thirty. It is hoped that interest in Geological studies may be stimulated by the practical treatment they received at Mr. Windle's hands. The thanks of the Club are due to Professor G. A. J. Cole, of Dublin, and to Mr. R. Welch, of Belfast, for their kind interest in the Club and for their assistance in giving and lending lantern slides specially intended to illustrate these Geological Lectures.

During the Summer Excursions took place as follows:—Thursday, May 5th, Quin Abbey; Thursday, May 19th, Sixmilebridge; Thursday, June 9th, Cahercon, Kildysart; Thursday, June 23rd, New Hall, Ennis; Wednesday, July 6th, Foynes; Thursday, July 21st, Curragh Chase; Saturday, July 9th, to Friday, July 15th, Kenmare and district, County Kerry, in conjunction with other Irish Field Clubs, under the auspices of The Irish Field Club Union.

It is a matter for congratulation that the very full programme of meetings—14 in all—for Winter Session of 1897-98, was carried out

in full; and that of the eight excursions arranged for the Summer of 1898, only one failed—that to Killaloe, on Easter Monday—the day being extremely inclement.

Financially, the Club is in a fair way, as may be gathered from the statement prepared by the Hon. Treasurer. The Committee are, however, practically unanimous in opinion, that the best interests of the Club will be served by increasing the annual subscription from 2/6 to 5/-. The additional cost in a year would not be felt by anyone, and it would enable the Club to do many things not now possible, such as making the Club-room more attractive and comfortable, furnishing it with glass-cases, presses, etc., providing diagrams and specimens for lecturers and essayists, cheapening, and if need be, subsidising the excursions, or providing apparatus for special purposes such as dredging, excavating, cave-exploring, etc. The slight increase spoken of would only put our subscription on a level with that of the other Irish Field Clubs; and it would at once enable your Committee to publish a Journal full of interesting matter and worthy of the Limerick Club, and to present a copy to every member without the fear of its pressing too heavily on the funds available. This matter is commended to the favourable consideration of the members for another year.

The membership of the Club was 240 on 31st December, 1897; it now stands at 276. The Rules have not been issued for some years, and as slight revisions appear desirable, a new draft will be submitted to this meeting.

On the proposition of Mr Neale, seconded by Dr. Frost, the report was adopted.

The Mayor presided at the election of Officers and Committee.

LIMERICK FIELD CLUB.

Meetings of the Club, *open free to all members*, are held during the Winter months in the Club Room, Glentworth Street, a detailed Programme being sent to each member at the beginning of the Session. Courses of Lectures are also occasionally arranged, dealing with specific subjects. These are open only to members of the Club. Special sectional meetings are also held when summoned by their respective Hon. Secretaries.

Excursions are organised by the Committee, during the Summer months, to places of interest in the neighbourhood, the cost of each being fixed at such a sum *to members* as will prevent *loss* to the Club. Very favourable terms have been given by the Railway and Steamship Companies to the Club in connection with the excursions, of which members are given the full benefit.

The Club is affiliated with THE IRISH FIELD CLUB UNION, being thereby in close touch with similar societies in Dublin, Belfast, and Cork.

A Journal is issued by the Club, a copy being given free to each member.

There is a Photographic Dark Room connected with the Club, to which the members have free access.

EXCURSIONS—1899.

As an indispensable aid to the study of *Natural Science*, there can be no two opinions on this subject, and the proposal has met with the unanimous approval of the Committee, who have decided that contributions towards it shall be limited to sums of 2/6 and under, in the hope that a very large number of members may identify themselves with it, rather than have it confined to a few giving larger amounts.

The instrument will be carefully selected by the Committee, who have much pleasure in commending the matter to the favourable consideration of every member of the Club.

RULES.

I.—That the Club shall be called "THE LIMERICK FIELD CLUB."

II.—That the objects of the Club shall be—The Study of Natural History, Photography, History and Archæology, especially of the district.

III.—That the Officers of the Club shall be elected annually, and consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, a Secretary, and a Committee of seven members. Three to form a *quorum*. Minutes of regular meetings, and records of all committee meetings shall be duly kept.

IV.—That special sections may be formed with the approval of an Annual Meeting from amongst the members of the Club, for the particular study of one or more of the objects named in Rule II., each of such sections having a Secretary with a seat *ex-officio* on the Committee of the Club.

V.—That the names and addresses of candidates for membership shall be given in writing to the Secretary for consideration by the Committee, which shall, through the Secretary, inform the applicant of its decision with as little delay as possible.

VI.—That the annual subscription shall be Two Shillings and Sixpence, payable in advance, and shall become due on the first day of January in each year. Members joining the Club after the first day of October in any year shall not be liable for the payment of any subscription for the year next following their admission. Any members whose subscriptions shall be three months in arrears, and who shall neglect to pay same in response to a *second application* from the Treasurer, shall cease to be members of the Club.

VII.—That arrangements shall be made for Meetings and Excursions from time to time by the Committee, of which due notice shall be given to all members by the Secretary.

VIII.—That the Annual Meeting shall be held in the month of January to receive Report of Committee for past year, to elect Officers and Committee for ensuing year, and to transact such other business as may come before it. The voting for Officers and Committee shall be by ballot, the nominations having been made at the preceding ordinary meeting of the Club.

IX.—No alteration shall be made in these Rules except by an Annual Meeting, and then only on notice of the proposed change having been given in writing at least twenty-one days previously to the Secretary. Necessary Bye-laws may be made by the Committee, which is also empowered to act on behalf of the Club in all matters pertaining to its welfare during the *interim* between general meetings.
