GENTLEMEN,

IN my Address of the 22d of November, I called
your attention and attendance at the City Court
House, on the 2d inst. yesterday, being the day to which the
Quarter Sessions were adjourned, where, I assure you, I was
much gratified at meeting so Respectable a Body, wishing to
Register their Freeholds, but regret with them, that all our
persuasion and applications were in vain, as out of Six
Magistrates, none appeared but the Recorder; by which our
wishes as that of your's, were defeated, as not less than two
Magistrates can Register.

When you feel, that it is the same Common Council, who
refused many of you your freedoms, that appointed those
Magistrates, and that some of those Magistrates, lately registered
for the present Member by candle light, and will not register
for you by day light, and that this is the fourth year of their
re.election, you must perceive the Intent and Drift, if the
Common Council, *Glory*, in thus depriving you of your
Elective Franchises, you are not without yours as every one
must feel, the Conclave have totted their force, and are afraid
to meet you Constitutionally, which I hail, as a day of triumph,
to all, within our city and its liberties, even to those, who
purpose voting against me, I know they are not many, and I
expect to see the day, all will feel, that my only views are
theirs, and that of the inhabitants in general.

Be assured I feel as you all do, the contempt thus offered
to our Rights and feelings, which shall, without delay, be
submitted to a High Tribunal, as my advice is, no longer to
stoop or crave for that, which we can force; its remarkable,
we never resorted to force, till driven to it; and that in every
instance we have forced our Opponents to do their duty. I
shall shortly give you a list of the Nominal Common Council
of this City, with the Solemn Oath of that Body; and, be
assured, I shall never lose sight of any matter that may tend
to the interest and information of my Fellow Citizens,
