## THE CITY REVISION.

### Claims to Franchise.

Sir Francis E. Kearney, Registration Officer,  
opened the Revision of the Parliamentary and  
municipal voters' lists in the County Courthouse  
this morning. He was occupied for a time in  
reading over the lists.

The Deputy Mayor (Alderman Mrs O'Donovan),  
Mr P A O'Brien, B.C; Mr W M Nolan, Town  
Clerk, and other officials were in attendance with  
the object of ascertaining if claims for votes not  
previously sent in could be considered during the  
course of the revision.

After a certain amount of discussion, it  
transpired that it was not in the power of the  
Registration Officer, according to the regulations  
governing the procedure, to consider any  
application for admission to the franchise at this  
stage, other than claims lodged in accordance  
with the notice issued by the Registration Officer.

An arrangement was come to by which repre-  
sentatives of the different city wards would give  
every assistance to Sir Francis in ensuring the  
accuracy of the lists and facilitating the work of  
the revision.

The feeling was expressed that as far as the  
limitation of the regulations permitted, Sir Francis  
Kearney met the representations made by the  
Deputy Mayor, Mr O'Brien and the Town Clerk  
as fairly as could be expected by giving every  
facility to people entitled to be on the register.
