De Valera's Plea for Peace.

De Valera's Plea on To-morrow.

The meeting of Dail Eireann to discuss the Peace Treaty began yesterday in the evening at the University College, Dublin, in a secret session, and will continue to-day in public, when the great question of accepting or rejecting the Articles of Agreement will be taken.

De Valera explained how the Plenipotentiaries, on the understanding, he reported the Cabinet would accept whatever arrangement they have to be submitted to the Dail. The Cabinet and the Plenipotentiaries agreed up to a certain point, but had to be decided, and they drew particular attention to the Delegates' instructions—that the draft Treaty about to be submitted to the Cabinet in London was only awaited.

De Valera immediately controverted any suggestion that the Plenipotentiaries exceeded their authority. Mr de Valera said the Plenipotentiaries had not exceeded, but were not bound to accept the letter.

De Valera objected against production of the original instructions.

KILMALLOCK SENSATION.

Police Sergeant Shot Dead.

Constable Wounded.

A sensational shooting affair occurred in Kilmallock last night, resulting in the instantaneous death of Sergeant Enright, and the serious wounding of a constable who accompanied him on the occasion. The deceased sergeant was in Kilmallock, attending the coursing meeting during the day, having travelled from Thurles, where he was stationed. He was leaving Cleary's Hotel shortly after 11 o'clock with his companion, when they were confronted by, it is stated, five men, who fired point-blank at them. The sergeant died immediately, and the constable received bullets in five or six places. The assailants then decamped, and the noise of the firing brought people into the street, who were shocked when the discovery was made. The body of Sergeant Enright was removed to the police barrack, and the wounded constable was conveyed to the Military Hospital, Limerick, where his condition was pronounced critical. Sergeant Enright was a native of Listowel, and was twenty-eight years of age. He was a married man, and served in the late war, holding an army commission. To-day County Inspector Regan, Limerick, visited Kilmallock for the purpose of instituting inquiries into the tragedy.

The Constable's name is ascertained to be Timmonee, who was also stationed in Thurles. Enquiries made this evening at the Military Hospital, showed that his condition was not as critical as at first reported.
