We observed with much pleasure, the sentence passed by our worthy Recorder at the close of his Sessions, on a prisoner named James Short, convicted on a charge of keeping a brothel in Post-office lane in this City. The scenes that are constantly enacted in those dens of iniquity, which abound in that locality, are most revolting. In fact, few persons, except the authorities, are aware of the vices, profligacy, drunkenness, and robberies, which nightly characterise those haunts of the abandoned characters which infest the streets. In the month of September last, a man named Michael Moran lost his life in Short's house, and at an inquest held on the body at Barrington's Hospital by Alderman Watson, it appeared in evidence that there were *sixteen* unfortunate women living in the house, and paying rent to the prisoner, and Mary Meehan, a prostitute, was fully committed to abide her trial at the Assizes for the murder of the deceased. We, therefore, hail this proceeding as one likely to lead to the most beneficial results as regards public morality, and we confidently anticipate that it will be followed up by similar measures against the wretches who keep such establishments, until they shall be completely eradicated by the strong arm of the law.

On Saturday evening, the passengers on the railway from Kingstown to Dublin were greatly terrified, by one of the carriages being dragged from the train. Amongst the persons slightly injured were—Mr. Walker J. Mason, of this City, and a man named Thompson.

Seventeen persons were brought up at the Police office on Monday, for drunkenness and fined in the full penalty, a larger number than has been known on any occasion for the last two years.

The trade by Inland canal, between this City and Dublin, has been interrupted by the frost.

On Monday evening, a boy aged seven years, son of William Pickett, a labourer, was sitting by the fire at a cellar in Bridge-street, when his bib accidentally caught fire, and he was dreadfully burned before any assistance was rendered, there being only a child of his own age with him at the time. The little sufferer was at once conveyed to Barrington's Hospital, where the promptest aid was afforded him, but without success, as he died on yesterday morning. An inquest was held on the body, and a verdict of accidental death returned.

On Sunday, Mr. Cox, Coroner, held an inquest on the body of Mary Molony, wife to a farmer, who met her death by falling out of a car at Grange Bridge, as she was returning from the market of Newcastle. She was the mother of four young children. Verdict—Accidental death.
