COUNTRY NEWS.

Belfast, Dec. 19. The brig Lord Kilward
lin, Capt. Smith, from this port to Alicante,
which failed some time ago, is put back here,
with the loss of her main top mast and 2 boys.

The Lord Chief Baron Yelverton, is hourly
expected in this town.

On Friday last arrived in our Lough, a
smuggling sloop called the Two Brothers of
Guernsey, laden with 40,000lb. weight of leaf
tobacco, and 180 anker casks of strong French
brandy; prize to the Royal George revenue
cutter, Captain Crawford, from Scotland.

By a gentleman arrived here from Glasgow,
we hear of the arrival there of two vessels last
week from New York—by the papers brought
by them and private letters from thence it ap
pears, nothing but anarchy and confusion reign
in the New England States, and that they are
on the eve of another revolution.

C O R K, Dec. 21.

On Tuesday the 12th instant Mr. W. B.
Swan, Inspector of Excise, assisted by Mr.
Henry, Supernumerary Gauger, detected two
extensive private distilleries in Mitchelstown,
and spilled a considerable quantity of pot ale
in each. Before Mr. Swan could procure pro
tection to secure the stills, they were re
moved, but on application to Lord Kingsbo
rough, his Lordship immediately sent his
Agent Mr. Frith, with a party of his servants
in arms, to make search for the stills, and one
of them we hear was recovered and lodged in
the Castle. It were much to be wished that
every Nobleman and Gentleman in the king
dom, would imitate the example shewn by his
Lordship on this occasion, and support the
Officers of the Revenue in the suppression of
private distilleries, by which means the fair
trader would be protected, the revenue en
creased, and the morals and health of the
lower order of the people essentially served.

These distilleries, make up no less a number
than seven, detected within a few weeks by
the above spirited conduct of Mr. Swan.

Tuesday night Daniel Mahony, an honest
industrious Falter, fell from a boat where he
was loading beef, and was unfortunately
drowned. He has left a wife and three infants
in the greatest indigence.

Same night a servant girl, belonging to a
Gentleman at Cross's-green, threw herself
into the river at Wandsworth-bridge, after
declaring to a man who stood near her, that
she was perfectly innocent of a theft she was
charged with. The man leaped into a boat
to save her, and it is said she pushed it off
from her.

Kilkenny, Dec. 20. Early yesterday morn
ing, a number of men surrounded the house of
Mr. Oliver Leonard, of Ballicannon, about six
miles from this city, with intent, as is sup
posed, to murder him; but being well pro
vided with fire arms, he gave them a warm re
ception, whereby one John Rourke was killed
on the spot, and another man dangerously
wounded, on which they retreated, after hav
ing first set fire to his house and fired upwards
of fifty shots into it, whereby Mr. Leonard
and his wife were desperately wounded. The
cool collected courage of Mr. L. who defended
himself singly against such a number of armed
midnight ruffians, is spoken of in terms of the
highest applause.

Clonmel, Dec. 21. Committed to our Coun
ty Jail, by Nathaniel Mitchel, Esq;—James
Kelly, charged (by Information, sworn before
Nep. Blood, Esq; a justice of the co. Clare)
with stealing four Cows, from the Lands of
Mount Rice, in said County, the property
of James O'Sullivan, Esq; of the City of
Limerick, Merchant.—Patrick Keran, John Meagher, and
Timothy Tierney, all of Killadigan, in this
County, farmers, charged on oath, with se
loniously counterfeiting and uttering three Re
ceipts for Money, with intent to defraud Mrs.
Mary Dawson, and the Rev. Thos. Sheppard,
of 45l. os. id. knowing the same to be coun
terfeited.
