The Bank of Ireland raised the rate of Discount on  
Bills, yesterday, to five per cent. instead of four. They  
are likewise issuing their notes, payable on demand, at the  
Bank of England, at nine per cent. Exchange.

The Provincial Banks are following the example of  
the National Banks, in raising their discount to five per  
cent.

The Bank of Ireland will pay a dividend of 5 per  
cent on their Bank Stock, on the 2d of January next.

The Hibernian Banking Company will pay a divi-  
dend of 2 per cent on their stock, on St. Stephen's day.
