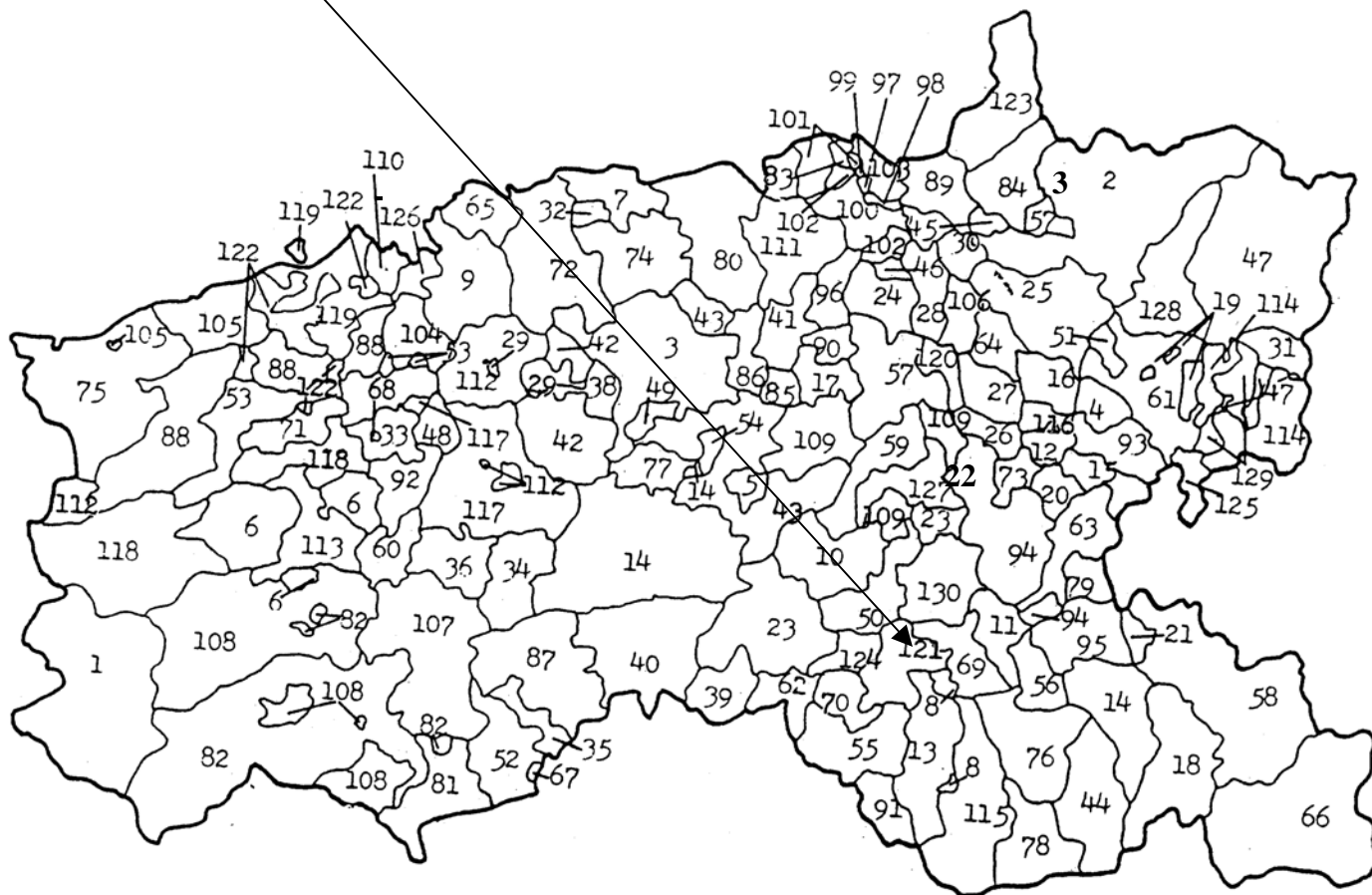

Bounded on the N. by the phs. of Dromin, Uregar & Kilbreedy Major; W. by the phs. of Tankardstown and Kilbreedy Minor; E. by the phs. of Kilbreedy Major, Kilquane and Ballingaddy; and S. by the phs. of Kilbreedy Minor and Effin.

This parish took its name from an old Abbey, founded by St. Mocheallog or St. Molach in the beginning of the 7th century. It contains 4,077 acres, statute measure, the whole arable land, well cultivated. In the E. of the parish there is a compact town, called Kilmallock, which contains a great many ancient buildings. The leading road from Cork to Limerick passes from N. to S. through the parish, running through Kilmallock Town, and several other roads branch in all directions. There are some ancient forts interspersed throughout the td. S.W. of Kilmallock Town, there is a lough and a Gentleman's demesne.
