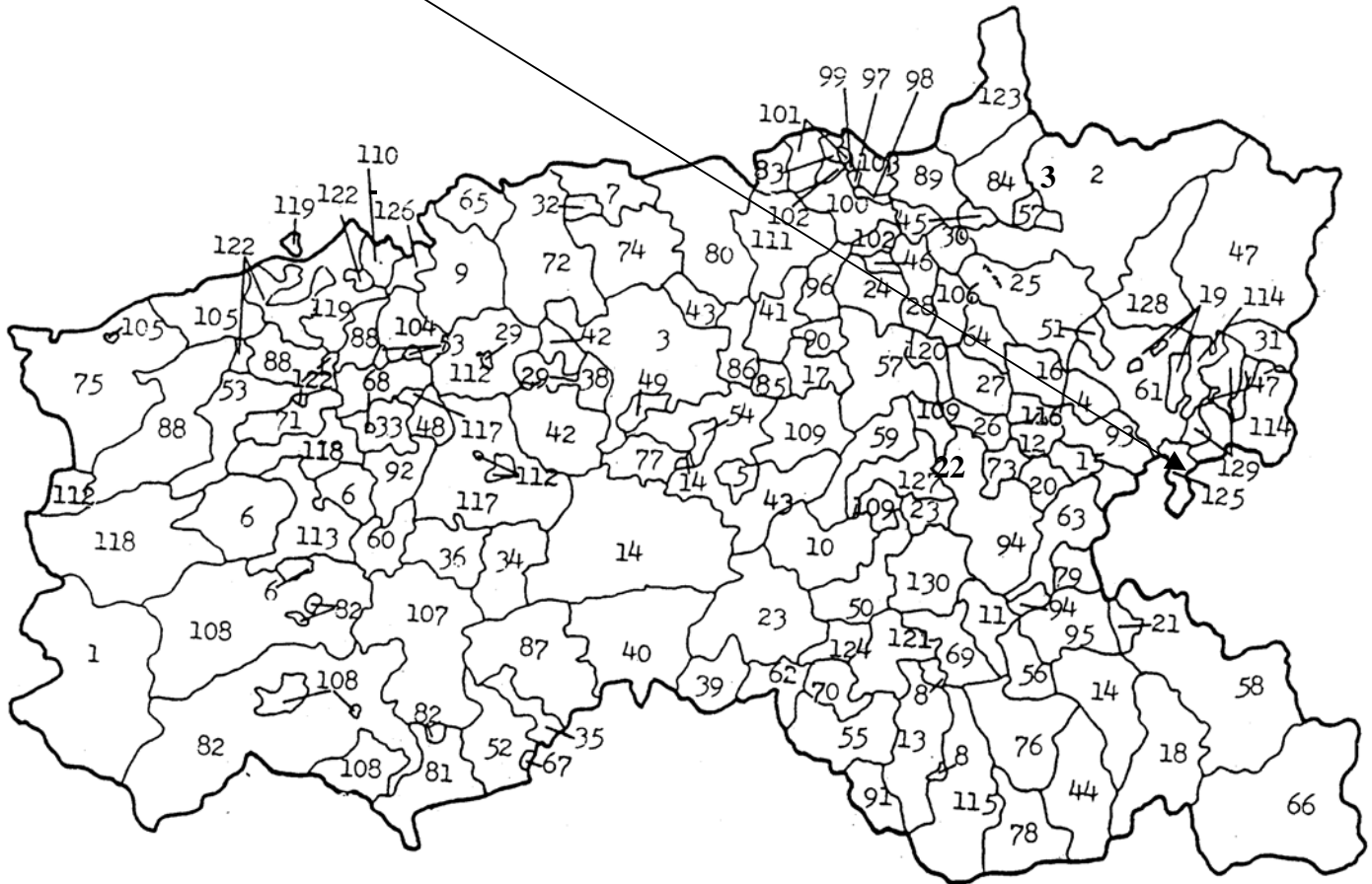

Situated in the south of the Barony of Coonagh and about 12 miles S.E. of the City of Limerick. It is bounded on the S. by the County of Tipperary; E. by part of the same and by the Ph. of Oola; N. by Cluggin and Pallas; and W. by part of the latter and by the Co. of Tipperary.

This parish is about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles long and $\frac{1}{4}$ mile broad, containing 12 townlands. It consists of level, arable land, with a road leading N. and S. through its west end from the village of Pallas Green to Emly in Tipperary.

This td. contains 164 acres, which are arable and with some limestone. Soil partly deep, producing potatoes, corn, flax and wheat. The proprietors the Representatives of Roger S. Keating, Esq. have it let to

Eyre Lloyd, Esq. by a lease for ever, and he again to 2 tenants by leases of 3 lives and 31 years at £2 17s. to £1 13s. per acre. Co. Cess 1s.4d. to 1s.8d. per acre half yearly. Tithe 1s.6d. per acre.

Note:- This is the townland in which General Sarsfield surprised and destroyed King William's siege train of artillery during the Siege of Limerick.

Cess generally 1s.7d. to 1s.8d. per acre half yearly. Tithe 1s.8d. per acre. Bog used for fuel is very scarce.

Situated in the north-west end of the parish.

This td. contains 27 acres, which are arable and without limestone. Soil partly light, producing potatoes, corn and flax. The proprietors "The Governors of Schools founded by Erasmus Smyth, Esq." have it let to Darby O'Grady, Esq. by a lease ending in 1855 at £1 7s. per acre. Co. Cess 1s.4d. to 1s.6d. per acre half yearly. Tithe 2s. per acre. Bog for fuel is very scarce.

Note:- This td. takes its name from a species of timber or plant, called "Dutch Alder", in Irish "Burrog", which was planted of old in a certain type of ditch. So, properly speaking, the name is Claidhe na Burroige, the ditch of the Dutch alder.

Justice, and he again to 6 tenants by leases of 2 lives at £2 10s. per acre. Co. Cess generally 1s.7d. per acre half yearly. Tithe 1s.9d. per acre. Bog used for fuel is very scarce and bought.

Co. Cess generally 1s.4d. to 1s.8d. per acre half yearly. Tithe not paid since 1834. Bog used for fuel is very scarce and is bought by the tenantry. Prevailing Names; Hanly and Hogan.

Crowe, Esq. by a lease of 3 lives to 1 tenant at £2 15s. per acre. Co. Cess generally 1s.4d. to 1s.8d. per acre half yearly. Tithe 1s.6d. per do. Bog used for fuel is very scarce.

This td. contains 67 acres, which are arable and without limestone. Soil partly deep, producing potatoes, corn, flax and some wheat. The proprietor the Archbishop of Cashel has it let to John Baily, Esq., of Newpark, and others, and they again to 4 tenants at will and at £2 15s. per acre. Co. Cess generally 1s.4d. to 1s.8d. per acre half yearly. Tithe not paid since 1830. Bog used for fuel is very scarce and is bought by the tenantry.

Situated on the boundary of the counties Tipperary and Limerick, and on the N.W. boundary of Garrydoolis Td.

This is the union or crossing of two roads nearly at right angles, the one leading from Kiltteely to Tipperary and the other from Emly to Pallas Green. There is one licensed public house here, and there are also a few poor cabins.

Situated on the union of the parishes of Templebredon, Pallasgrean and Oola, also on the union of the tds. of Ballyneety, Derk and Treanmanagh, and on the road from Pallas Grean to Emly.

This village contains about 12 poor mud houses. It derived its name from some Palatines who lived there.
