A narrow point of land running off the shore of the River Shannon.

Lick Point -- Local

On the N. side of Foynes Island.

A part well known to sea men on the Shannon.

Strandfields -- Thos. Maddagin, Glin.

1½ miles west of Foynes Village, along the Shannon shore.

Well known green fields.

Abbey Lodge and  
Abbey Mills } -- Thompson Russell, Esq. 14

Skirting the west side of Askeaton.

A new built house, etc. Improvements made about it.

- Prospect -- Edwd. Davinport, Esq.  
Resident  
2½ miles N.E. of Askeaton and 2½ miles W. of  
Pallaskenry.  
A two-story slated house on a conspicuous eminence.
- Moig Cottage -- Peter Switzer  
2 miles west of Pallaskenry.  
A neat cottage and orchard, &c.
- Rockfield Towers -- John S. Peppard, 15  
Rathkeal  
Is about 1 mile N.W. of Rathkeale.  
A new building of a castle form. The residence  
of the proprietor is Cappagh House, and Rathkeale is  
his Post Town.
- Greenhills -- Peter Franklin
- Kilpeacon Demesne -- Edwd. Villiers, Esq.  
3½ miles N.E. of Croom.  
A fair sized demesne, about to be made more extensive.
- Askeaton Parochial School -- George Maxwell, Vicar 16  
of Askeaton  
On the east side of Askeaton.  
Was formerly called the London Hibernian Society's  
School House. It is built in an old Glebe, called the  
Vicar's Field.
- Thornberry Cottage -- Stephen De Vere, Esq.  
On the west side of Curraghchase.  
The residence of Stephen De Vere, Esq.
- Ballynort House Ruins -- Local 17  
1½ miles N.E. of Askeaton.  
A very ancient house, formerly the residence of Lord  
Massey.
- Toberfordun -- Tenantry on the Lands.  
Midway between Askeaton and Pallaskenry.  
A spring called after a Gentleman in former times.

- Glenirkey -- Tenantry on the Lands.  
2 miles south of Pallaskenry.  
A natural glen in the limestone rocks.
- Paddock Hill -- Thad. Brown, a tenant 18  
on the land.  
Near the road from St. Patrickswell to Croom.  
A yellow hill in an old deer park.
- Barnalicky House -- Edwd. Davinport, the  
owner.
- The Bridge Farm -- Earl of Dunraven  
Near Adare Bridge.  
A subdenomination of a td.
- Ruins of a R. C. Chapel -- Local 19  
In the td. of Ballynahallee and about  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile S.W.  
of Kildimo (new).  
Only a part of the walls remain.
- The Ferry Bridge -- Several Authorities  
About midway between Clarina and Kildimo (new) on  
the road, by which the River Maigue is crossed.  
A new metal bridge now in progress of construction,  
to let sailing boats pass from the Shannon to Adare.  
A swivel bridge.
- Cloughregaun or }  
Regans Rocks -- Patk Boyle 20  
Near the roadside in the Td. of Corcamore.  
A large standing-stone, 7 ft. high and 3 ft. square,  
standing upright.
- Toberivy -- Local  
Near the Mail Coach Road from Limerick to Cork,  $1\frac{1}{2}$   
miles from the former.  
An excellent spring, said to have been a Holy Well.
- Roche Castle -- Sir David Roche, M.P. 21  
On the lands of Ballycummin, about 2 miles south of  
Limerick.  
A new octagon castle with circular stair-case adjacent  
to the farm yard.

Cahernarry House-- Alderman Cripps of  
Limerick

On the lands of Cahernarry, adjacent to the Mail Coach Road from Limerick to Cork, and 4 miles from the former.

An old seat near the Church, with conspicuous plantings about it.

Cahernarry Glebe House

-- The Resident Minister

On the lands of Cahernarry adjacent to the Mail Coach Road from Limerick to Cork and 4 miles from the former.

A small house on the Glebe land.

Sutherland Cottage-- Patk. O'Gorman, Esq., 22  
the resident Gentleman,  
who is an Alderman.

In the td. of Rathbane (South), adjoining the public road from Limerick to Charleville, and 1 mile south of Limerick.

Rathbane House

-- The resident Gentleman

In the td. of Rathbane (South).

A small seat with some planting.

Bush Island Cottage

-- D. Barrington

On the lands of Lickadoon

A neat cottage inhabited by his steward or caretaker.

Ahabeg House

-- Michael Lloyd Apjohn 23

In the td. of the same name, near the road from Limerick to Tipperary.

A small house, with a plantation of firs about it.

Castle Lodge

-- Michael Cox

About 1 mile N. of Caherconlish.

A newly built house, the residence of Mr. Cox.

Inch

-- Local Village Name

Nearly a mile N.W. of Caherconlish.

A few houses on the main road.

Ballyneety

-- Propr. of Ballyneety Ho.

Nearly 2 miles from Caherconlish.

Abington -- Ph. Priest, Abington.

Cloverhill House -- John Greegon (?) 24

Adjacent to the public road from Caherconlish to Pallas Green, 4 miles from the former.

A 2-story slated house on a conspicuous part of the td. of Clover Cloverfield.

Ballybrood Rectory -- Revd. Robt. Bell, D.D.

On the Glebe Land of Ballybrood,  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile south of the village.

A good 3-story house with ornamental ground &c. about it.

Mountminnett House -- Patk. Keating, Occupier

In the td. of Mountminnett,  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile S. of the Village of Ballybrood.

A low house with offices and an orchard and with a few trees about it.

Castle Comfort -- Revd. Mr. Costelloe, P.P. 25  
Abington

Near the village of Abington, where there was formerly a large butter market, now discontinued.

There is still a Fair Green near to this village. It is said by the Parish Priest that his house is built on the site of an ancient castle.

Ballybrood Village -- Revd. Robt. Bell, D.D. 26

About  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles S. of Caherconlish, which is the Post Town.

A small village in the parish of the same name, having a Fair Green on its N.E. side.

Eyon House -- Mr. Laffin, Proprietor 27

In the td. of the same name, 3 miles E. of Caherconlish.

A 3-story house accomodating a respectable family.

Mountfune -- Mr. Deehy, Proprietor

In the td. of Mongfune and 4 miles S. of Newport.

A respectable farm-house. Mountfune is the popular name.

- Holly Park -- Ellen Bearie, Proprietor  
 In the td. of Bilboa.  
 A good farm house. The name is given to it by the proprietor.
- Rath Old House -- Jas. Raligh, a Surveyor 28  
 in Cappamore  
 In the td. of the same name.  
 This was formerly a Gentleman's seat. A high gable and a chimney still remain of it.
- Drumsallagh Old House  
Drumsallagh -- Jas. Raligh  
 In the td. of the same name.  
 This was formerly an extensive seat, and there is still a strong wall of it, with old trees about the place.
- Killuragh House  
 Killuragh -- Jas. Raligh
- Humphry's Bridge -- Jas. Raligh  
 A little south of Cappamore.  
 A large bridge by which the River Shannon is crossed. It took its name from one Humphry who lived near it.
- Doon House -- Ph. Priest of Doon 29  
 At the end of Doon Village.  
 An ancient house with some improvements about it.
- Toomeline -- Proprietor  
 About 1 mile E. of Doon  
 This is a modern built house with suitable offices, etc.
- Ullahilla Cottage -- Propr. 30  
 About  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile E. of the village of Oola.  
 A small, newly built house.
- Ulla Lodge -- Propr.  
 A little to the E. of Oola Village.  
 This is an old house and known for a long time by this name.

- Streamville -- Wm. Wilson, Propr. 31  
 In the td. of Spital-land,  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile S. of Limerick.
- Bellevue -- Wm. Alexander, Propr.  
 In the td. of Kilrush,  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile N. of Limerick.
- Clonlong House -- John Russell, Propr.  
 In the td. of Clonglong, 1 mile S. of Limerick.
- Court Brack Villa -- John Bradshaw, Propr. 32  
 In the td. of Courtbrack,  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile W. of Limerick.
- Coolraine -- John Vereker, Propr.  
 In the td. of Coolraine, West of Limerick.
- Fort Prospect -- Eliza Abraham.  
 In the td. of Rathbane,  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile S. of Limerick.
- Bellefield -- Danl. Gabbett, Junr. 33  
 In Farranshonemore Td., N. of Wellesly Bridge.
- Janesboro -- Wm. Bradshaw, Propr.  
 In Rathbane Td., a little south of Limerick.
- Willmount -- Eyre Powell, Kilpeacon  
 Rectory.  
 In Rathbane Td., about 1 mile S.W. of Limerick.
- Janeville -- Revd. G. E. Deacon, Propr. 34  
 In the td. of Kilrush,  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile N.W. of Limerick.
- Singland Cottage -- Godfrey Browne, Propr.  
 In the td. of Singland, 1 mile E. of Limerick.
- Rose Cottage -- Wm. J. Shaw  
 In the td. of Priorsland or Spital-land, at the S.E.

A little retired from Clare Street, Limerick.

In the td. of Corbally near the Police Station.

A neat seat with ornamental ground about it.

A little E. of Limerick, in Park Td.
- Henry Ville -- Patk. Coghlan,  
Singland Ho., Limerick  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  mile E. of Limerick.  
An old house, lately put in repair.
- Shannonville -- Revd. Mr. Walsh 39  
Adjacent to the Mail Coach Road to Galway, and about  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  mile from the Wellesley Bridge.  
A good house, with some ornamental ground about it.
- Courtbrack Lodge -- Saml. Dixon,  
Georges St. Limerick  
Adjacent to the Military Walk, south end of Limerick.  
A neat cottage.
- Ashbourne House and  
Demesne } -- Jas. Harvey, 3 Smithgrove 40  
Terrace, Cork  
In Courtbrack Td., convenient to Limerick City.  
A very handsome seat. This is the residence of  
Robert O'Brien, brother to Sir Lucius O'Brien and to  
Smith O'Brien, M.P.
- City Place -- John Russell of same.  
In the suburbs of Limerick, at the south end.  
This is a very handsome seat, the residence of a
