DEATH OF COUNTY LIMERICK PRIEST

FOUR MONTHS AFTER APPOINT- MENT AS P.P.

Four months after being appointed Parish Priest of the Holy Name Church, Hall Road, Hull, Rev. Father P. J. Buck- ley (40), a native of Limerick, and for five years secretary to the Most Rev. Dr. Thomas Shine, Bshop of Middlesbrough, has died. The Bishop presided at the Requiem Mass on Tuesday.

Father Buckley, who was ordained in June, 1924, served as assistant priest at Hicketing and Redcar for some years before being appointed Bishop's secre- tary. A zealous priest, he had acted as Di- ocesan Treasurer to the Catholic Educa- tion Council, the Church Extension Fund and Ecclesiastical Education Fund, and was also Chaplain to Nazareth House, Middlesbrough. He had been ailing for some few months.
