

# CEMENT WORKS EXPANSION PLAN

## Wharf to be built at Conniger

A VAST expansion of Cement Ltd. works at Castlemungret, Limerick, were revealed at a special meeting of the Limerick Harbour Board to-day. The plans envisage the construction of a deep-water wharf at Conniger, adjacent to Castlemungret and the stepping up of production of cement to approximately half-a-million tons per annum.

The Chairman, Mr. M. W. McGuire, told the meeting that for some time past there had been negotiations between the Harbour Commissioners and the Chairman and officials of Cement Ltd. concerning the plans for the expansion of the factory.

The Company were seeking the co-operation of the Harbour Commissioners for permission to build the new wharf which would mean that vessels of a considerably deeper draught would be able to berth at the factory and would greatly reduce costs.

Figures produced by the Company, continued Mr. McGuire, showed that 135,000 tons of coal per annum would be imported or alternatively 90,000 tons of oil and probably 35,000 tons of gypsum. The Cement Company were seeking a reduction of 50% on existing dock rates.

Mr. McGuire said that the upshot of the new venture would mean a considerable increase in the revenue to the Port of Limerick and was something that they had been looking forward to for many years.

### Fantastic

Members described the new developments as "fantastic and would be of immense development to the Port of Limerick."

The meeting unanimously approved of the plans submitted by Cement Ltd. and granted full permission for the Company to go ahead.

### STATEMENT BY CEMENT LTD. CHAIRMAN.

The following statement was issued by the Chairman of Cement Ltd., Mr. A. G. Laarsen, to-day regarding certain statements in some of to-day's papers and in Radio Eireann last night and this morning: "No decision has yet been taken by the Board of Cement Ltd. regarding the extension of the Cement Works. At the present time certain negotiations are being carried out between the Company and C.I.E. regarding freight rates. If these negotiations are concluded satisfactorily to Cement Ltd. the Board will, undoubtedly, site the extension at Limerick. It is expected that negotiations will be concluded within a week or 10 days."

When Mr. M. W. McGuire was contacted to-day and asked to comment on the statement made by Mr. Laarsen, he said that he had nothing to add to the statement he had made yesterday at the Harbour Board meeting.
