

Obsequies Of Founder Of Salesian College At Pallaskenry

The remains of the distinguished Salesian, Very Rev. Aloysius J. Sutherland, Salesian University Hostel, Dublin, who died rather suddenly in Cork on Thursday of last week were removed from the Cathedral, Cork, to the Chapel of the Salesian College, Pallaskenry, County Limerick, on Sunday. Interment was in the Community Cemetery on Monday following Solemn Office and Requiem Mass.

The late Dr. Sutherland, who celebrated his Golden Jubilee last September, was the founder of Pallaskenry College in 1919. He was a native of Cork.

THE PANAGYRIC

Sutherland when he was sent to Ireland in 1919 to found the new Agricultural and Missionary College at Pallaskenry. He said that the lifetime of service to the Salesian Order, given by Fr. Sutherland was well known and did not need recapitulation. It was fitting that he should be brought home to his last resting place at Pallaskenry and amongst people who had known, revered and loved him.
