### Mrs. A. Hanratty

The death of Mrs. Annie C. Hanratty, proprietress of Hanratty's Hotel, occurred on Sunday.

A life-long Republican, she was ever a generous subscriber to the independence movement. Her hotel since 1917 had been Mr. de Valera's headquarters whenever he visited Limerick. She remained loyal to the Republican cause when the "split" occurred in 1922, and became an enthusiastic supporter of Fianna Fail when the organisation was founded.

Member of an old Co. Limerick family, the Crowes of Foynes, she was very popular in Limerick, where she and her husband carried on a successful hotel business for about fifty years.

The funeral, which took place to-day from St. Michael's Church to Mount St. Lawrence Cemetery, was large and representative in character. Requiem Mass was celebrated by Rev. J. White, C.C., St. Michael's; deacon, Rev. R. O'Sullivan, C.C., do.; subdeacon, Rev. F. Crowley, CC. Other clergy present were—Rev. W. J. Carroll, Adm., St. Michael's; Rev. C. O.P.; Rev. Fr Ryan, O.M.I.; Rev. Fr Ambrose, O.F.M.
