

LIMERICK'S LOSS

Death of Mr J. P. Hartigan

Striking Tribute at Funeral

is with feelings of profound regret announce the death of Mr. John P. Hartigan, Jasmine Villas, Limerick, which took place on Tuesday night in a private nursing home, Dublin. The passing of this prominent citizen came unexpectedly, as very few, outside his family and immediate friends, were aware of his indisposition. He entered the Nursing Home about a fortnight ago and it was only at the last week of his illness that a grave turn, and which ended with peaceful resignation, following so quickly on the death of his brother, Mr. T. A. Hartigan, his death has a deeper poignancy. He was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Hartigan, Boher House, Bruff, member of a family that has been for generations identified with the social and administrative life of the County.

HAD NO COMPEER

Having received a good secondary education, Mr. Hartigan was appointed to the clerical staff of Limerick County Council when that body was established in 1899. In the practice of his duties he displayed ability and efficiency, but did not remain long in the service to receive recognition in the preferment which was bound to come to him. He resigned after a few years to enter on a career for which he was pre-eminently fitted—that of an Irish racing official.

In that capacity Jack Hartigan was outstanding; he had no compeer, and was equally proficient as Judge, Clerk of the Course and Clerk of the Stables. He had a prodigious knowledge of racing, and could give the pedigree of any thoroughbred without consulting a stud book. He was, it may be truthfully said, a mine of information where bloodstock were concerned, and most popular official. The Stewards of the Turf Club and National Hunt retained a high opinion of him, while owners and trainers, and everybody connected with racing had the utmost confidence in him.

A man of the highest integrity, he was full of energy, and this was exemplified in his management of Limerick Junction Mallow race fixtures. He brought him from virtual obscurity to the forefront. With his racing preoccupations, he deceased carried on the thriving business of Hartigan & Co., Auctioneers and Cattle Salesmen.

IN PRIVATE LIFE

In private life Jack Hartigan played his part with a fine grace and dignity. He had all those qualities which make men retain friendships: kindly, tolerant, cheerful and sympathetic, while the exercise of his charity—he gave freely and generously—is known only to those who were benefited, for he was not ostentatious in his benefactions. Every good and deserving case he helped and supported, and he was never happier than when participating in any movement calculated to advance the interests of Limerick.

His death has occasioned widespread grief among the people of every class, and left a void which it will not be easy to repair.

He was a good husband, a devoted father, and model citizen.

CARDINAL INNITZER.

According to persistent rumours, which cannot yet be confirmed, Cardinal Innitzer is to retire.

Rumours that Cardinal Innitzer would resign first became current soon after his palace was sacked by a mob last October. It was then said that he would be attached to the Vatican and would be succeeded as Archbishop of Vienna by one of the Bishops in North Germany, probably Count von Preysing, Bishop of Berlin.

The Cardinal, who has expressed anti-Nazi views, was a close friend of Dr. Schuschnigg, the former Austrian Chancellor. It is said that Dr. Schuschnigg never made an important decision without first consulting the Cardinal.

GERMANY'S PREPAREDNESS.

Germany's preparedness was emphasised by Grand Admiral Raeder, Commander-in-Chief of the German Navy, in a speech at the Navy League rally in Dresden. That the rally should coincide with the twenty-fifth anniversary of the war, he said, gave it an especial meaning, as, just as in 1914, the Powers hostile to Germany were once more at work to encircle Germany in order to wipe her out by a worse treaty than that of Versailles.

"We all know," he continued, "that these hopes of our opponents, whose real leader once again is Great Britain, are condemned to failure from the start, for our leader has forged the people's unity."
