DEATH OF MR. E. HOULIHAN

Well-known Co. Limerick Farmer.

The death of Mr. Edward Houlihan, of Rathcannan, Athlacca, Co. Limerick, has occasioned feelings of deep sorrow throughout a wide area and amongst a very large circle of friends. A member of an old and highly esteemed family, deceased was possessed of sterling qualities. He was an exemplary Catholic and a generous neighbour. A progressive member of the farming community, he was regarded as a model farmer and his advice and judgment were often sought. His passing at a comparatively early age is deeply regretted, and the huge cortege at the removal of the remains from Athlacca Church to the family burial ground at Anhid, where interment took place, testified to the esteem in which deceased was held. The assembly was representative of all sections of the community in County Limerick and North Cork, and was one of the largest ever seen in the district.
