

DEATH OF THE DUKE OF MARLBORO'.
The Central News says the Duke of Marlboro' died very suddenly, early this morning, at his residence, Bertleley Square, London, from an attack of cardiac syncope. His full name was Lord Lieutenant for Ireland from 1876 to '80. He is succeeded by his eldest son the Marquis of Blandford.

During the past twenty-four hours, 111 cholera deaths have occurred in Damietta, forty-three at Mau-ourah, four at Cherbine, and four at Amanoud.

The search for the bodies was again resumed this morning, but with little result. The divers were unable to enter the Daphne owing to the strong tide. Many interments are taking place to-day.
