On the 20th, the defendant's galleons were sold at Souffir, and the defendant's license which Morgan produced, entitling him to keep and use the explosives, was there by license he was ordered to have the explosives be directed to Morgan to inform the police.

In the first case the defendant was fined 25, and in the second case, for 10%.

Mr Morgan trusted that he would appear against the decision.
