Mr Bourke said before the prisoner pleaded he  
d to intercede for his Lordship's jurisdiction  
on affidavit. Counsel then read the affidavit of  
e prisoner, in which he prohibited against being  
ed in the City of Cork at the present Assizes in  
much as it was not provided by the Order in  
ouncil under the Winter Assizes Act a neigh-
