DEATH OF MR D M'ARTIE.

We regret to record the death of Mr Daniel McGillycuddy M'Cartie, third son of Mr Edward M'Cartie, of 63 Catharine street, who passed away at his residence early on yesterday morning at the early age of 23 years. Mr M'Cartie had been in delicate health for some months back, but his friends hoped that his illness was of a temporary character. It has proved otherwise, and a kind-hearted, genial companion and friend has passed away, to the inexpressible grief of his afflicted father and family, as well as a very large circle of acquaintances in this city. Mr M'Cartie had for seven years filled the position of clerk in the land agency office of Messrs James Nash and Son, and by his abilities and high moral rectitude, won the confidence and esteem of his employers, who deeply lament his loss. He was a member of the Limerick Bicycle Club, in which he took a great interest while his health permitted, and the same may be said regarding the Garryowen Football Club, to which he was also attached. Scores of his young friends gathered round his grave-side to-day to pay the last mark of respect to his memory, and very many representative citizens were there also.
