Timothy Ryan was yesterday charged at the Cork Assizes with the wilful murder of Patrick Sullivan, at Skibbereen, in November, 1881. The prisoner was originally convicted of assaulting the deceased, and was sentenced to seven years' penal servitude. Subsequently the Crown became possessed of evidence which induced them to put the prisoner on trial for wilful murder. On two occasions the jury disagreed, and yesterday, after a consultation of three hours, the jury disagreed.

At the County Antrim Assizes yesterday, Mr. Justice Lawson passed sentence on twelve men convicted on Friday last and Tuesday, of having conspired to murder certain landlords and other persons unknown, at Crossmaglen, County Armagh. Ten of them, Nugent, Dailey, Kelly, Watters, Devlin, Finnegan, Geoghegan, Han-ratty, Coleman, and Smyth were sentenced to ten years, M'Bride to seven years, and O'Hanlon to five years' penal servitude. His Lordship, in passing sentence, commented strongly upon the futility of such associations.
