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LIMERICK MARKET TRUSTEES.

The monthly meeting of the Limerick Market Trustees was held yesterday in the Boardroom Chamber of Commerce, the Mayor presiding.

MR. J. FRAWLEY, Inspector of Markets, submitted his monthly report. The total amount of market tolls received in the month of April last was £204 2s, showing an increase of £5 11s 10d as compared with the corresponding month of last year.

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INSPECTORS now wrote stating that the gentleman who made the report in question to them declined to allow his name to be mentioned, as requested by the Conservators.
