Mr. L. Kelly then followed, and inveighed in very strong language against such practice, and against the toleration of Bowdy Lane establishment in Limerick; it would be a constant cause of strife amongst the Catholics and Protestants of the city.

Mr. Michael Robert Ryan, after some remarks, stated that until there was a complete change in the regulation they could not entertain this question. Let them place the Catholic Bishop by the side of the Protestant Bishop, and the Catholic Dean by the side of the Protestant Dean and then they could agree with the movement better (hear).

It now being getting late, a division was called for and took place, when a large majority of the members decided that the claim for £150 for St. John's Fever Hospital should be expunged, and the claim for £100 for Barrington's Hospital shared the same fate.

The council shortly afterwards adjourned.
