CAR DAMAGED.

Taken From Outside Hotel at Limerick

A motor crash on the outskirts of Cashel soon after 12 o'clock on Monday night resulted in extensive damage to the car as well as the tearing away of a low stone wall at the junction of the Circular Road and the Gould's Cross Roads. The motor—a saloon—was at Limerick, where its owner, Mr. A. Hutchinson, Aughrim, Castledawson, Co. Derry, travelled for the Bank Holiday motor races. The radiator, mudguards and steering of the car were badly damaged.

There was a sequel to the crash on Monday evening, when three young men named S. Costelloe, H. Millett and T. Millett, residing in Dublin, were, at a special court held at Cashel, before Mr F. Phillips, P.C., charged with the larceny of a motor car, value £200, the property of Mr. A. Hutchinson, Aughrim, Castledawson, Co. Derry. They were further charged with taking the motor without having obtained the owner's permission, with dangerous driving, and not having a driver's licence.

Supt. Moore, who had charge of the case, deposed to the arrest of the three accused at Dundrum, in Co. Tipperary, and to their having made statements which he would not put in as evidence at that stage, as he had not completed his inquiries. He applied to have the accused remanded to Dundrum (County Tipperary) District Court on August 4th.

John Healy (35), an unmarried farmer, living at Liscanane, Claregalway, was found dead in his home on Tuesday. Behind the bed was an open blood-stained razor.

At an inquest Sergeant Monaghan, Carrandulla, stated that there was no sign of a struggle in the room.

Dr. George Joyce stated that death was, in his opinion, due to shock and hæmorrhage and suffocation, caused by wounds self-inflicted.

ARTIFICIAL SILK.

Minimum Duty Per Square Yard

The Government has made an Order under the Emergency Imposition of Duties Act, 1932, the effect of which is that knitted fabric containing not less than 40 per cent. by way of artificial silk already subject to a Customs duty at the rate of 60 per cent. ad valorem (40 per cent. preferential) will be subject to a minimum duty of 41s. per square yard (3d. per square yard preferential) from Wednesday.
