But no. He is one of the new pop whizz-kids who uses modern technology and plays the lot himself, including the vocals.

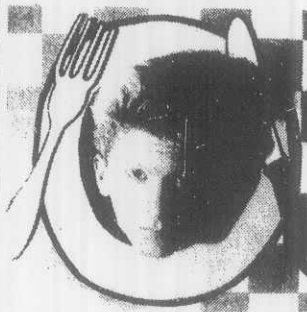
It was during his time studying at the School of Art in Limerick that Barry, who plays keyboard, first started his home cassettes. He had three made before he left the college.

Since he moved to Dublin and full-time work in the pop business, his career has taken off and along with receiving air play on RTE he has received some very complimentary reviews from the critics.

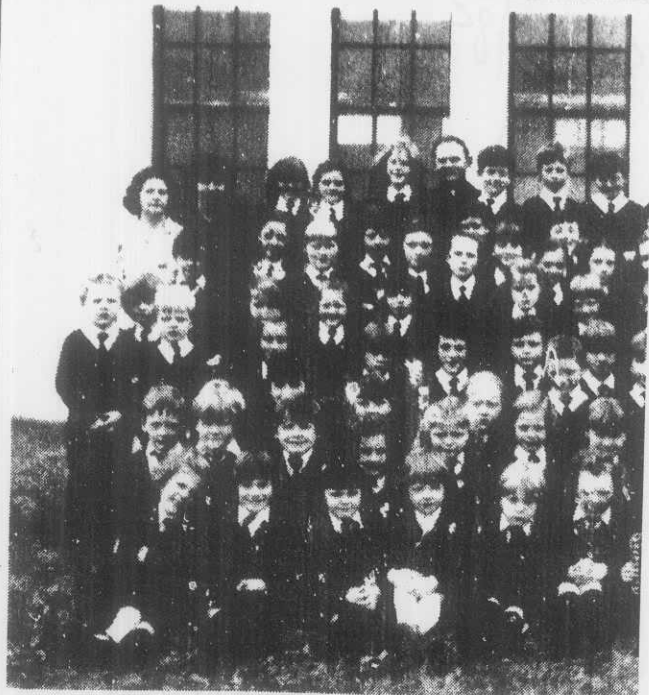
Barry explained this week that live work is out of the question at the moment as for a proper sound he would need about 10 musicians.

Scanglo a winnin

A NEW ENERGY saving product and a valuable new American contract were officially announced for Scanglo International, Newcastle West, by Mr. Eddie Collins, T.D., Minister for State at the Department of Industry, Trade, Commerce and Tourism, when he visited the plant this week.

The type of thermostatic radiator valve being manufactured by Scanglo which enables radiators to automatically adjust to individual room temperatures has considerable energy conservation potential for both homes and offices.

Mr. Collins said that he hoped that the device, which could mean a saving of about 10 per cent on fuel bills, would become a common feature of Irish heating systems.
