- In just over a year Cork based group The Dukes of Jazz have made an incredible impact on the southern entertainment scene.
- Playing the music of Shakatak, Stevie Wonder, Paul Simon, Duke Ellington and many original compositions, the group have been a huge hit with dancers, jazz fans and listeners alike.
- "Our aim is to entertain people wherever we ever we play", says trumpet and flugel horn player Tony Neenan. Tony's partner in the front line is flute-tenor sax star, Noel Moynihan, who vocals add to the distinctive sound.
- The Dukes are powered by the considerable talents of keyboard player and singer Al McCarthy and completing the line-up is the drummer and singing star Pat O'Hare, whether doing an all-vocal Manhattan Transfer number, blowing up a storm playing Shakatak the group have the distinctive big band sound.
- Residencies in top hotels, Jurys, Cor Deerpark, Charleville, and Riversdale House Kenmare, have made the band one of the most professional in the country to-day.
- The Dukes were an instant success on their first U.K. tour. Club dates in Boston, U.S.A., and invitations to festivals in Sweden and Holland made 1986 a very exciting time for the band and work has begun on an L.P. using some of their own material as well as a cross-section of the music they play on stage.
- The incredible playing, singing and to entertainment factor make the Dukes of Jazz a force to be reckoned with on the Irish entertainment scene today.

### The Cecilians

- HELLO DOLLY—the stage musical which made its impact in 1964—will be the Cecilians' production at the Crescent Theatre, commencing on Friday, February 28.
- The film was recently screened on RTE and remains an all-time musical classic.
- This will be a family show with a young cast whose vitality and punch should make it an instant hit with Limerick audiences.
- The title role will be played by Phil O'Neill who needs no introduction to patrons of the Cecilians productions, while Gus Barrett, Dick Wood and Ann Carey will be among the glittering and competent cast.
- Many years ago, having missed seeing the film in Limerick, I went to see it in a luxury cinema in Palma.
- The dialogue was dubbed in Spanish, but songs were in English with Spanish sub-titles. It's an unusual experience which was made all the more enjoyable as the cinema roof rolled back to make a night under the stars.
