The 12 inch version of the single is by far a more attractive proposition than the 7 inch. It features a marvel-lously moody extra track called "Don't Go Away" which is all of nearly 8½ minutes long.

Windmill Lane Studies in Dublin and was produced by Steve Brown who has also worked with "The Cult". Everything from the recording and mixing to the presentation of the record sleeve is totally slick.

The record took six days to finish and judging by the finished product Steve Brown seems to have been a good choice. "Initially, as always, when you start work with someone new you have teething problems but they were soon ironed out and Steve proved to be very helpful. It was made a lot easier by the fact that we know exactly what we want to sound like", said Dave Keary.

"Tunnel Vision", Ralf says, is "all about ambition and removing the negative things and getting on with it". The attitude expressed in this song I think sums up the attitude of the band perfectly and is a sort of auto-biographical piece.
"Don't Go Away" as I have already said is a totally moody piece and could easily be the sound track for a film like

"Apocolypse Now" or "The Deer Hunter" and I think this particular track has already been sent to some film produc-

"Tell The Boys" which is the b-side of the 7 inch is the weakest of the three songs but nevertheless is well above standard. What a great comparint

The single is receiving some attention in England having been played on Radio 1 by Simon Bates (daytime airpay) and Janice Long (the equivalent of RTE's Dave Fanning) and also on Capital Radio. It also received a favourable review in "Smash Hits" music magazine last week.

In Ireland it has been getting a lot of national airplay and many favourable reviews.
