She was last in Ireland with her parents and her brother Jim in 1947.

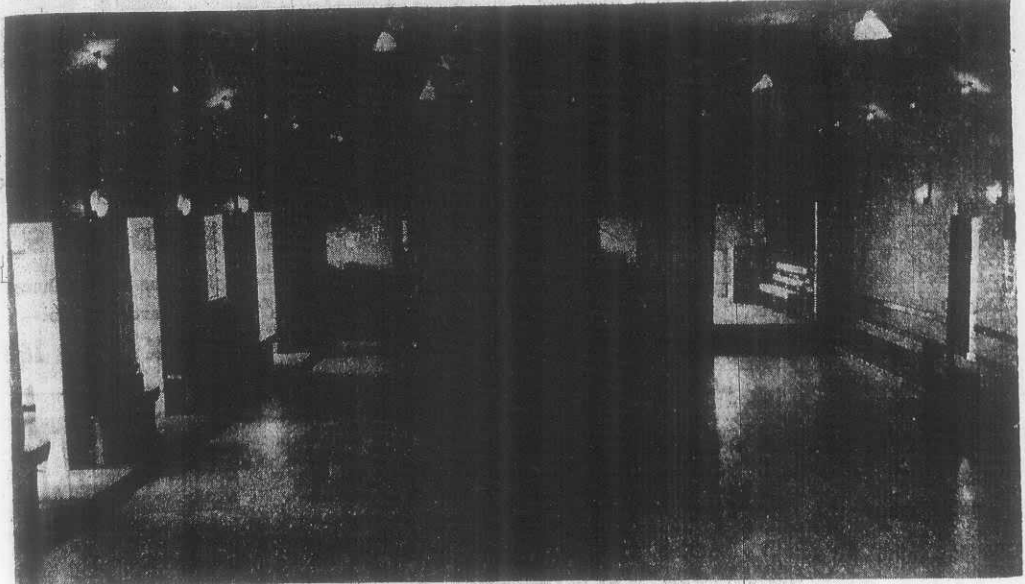
Miss Ryan graduated in June from St. Mary's Academy and this present trip is a graduation present.
