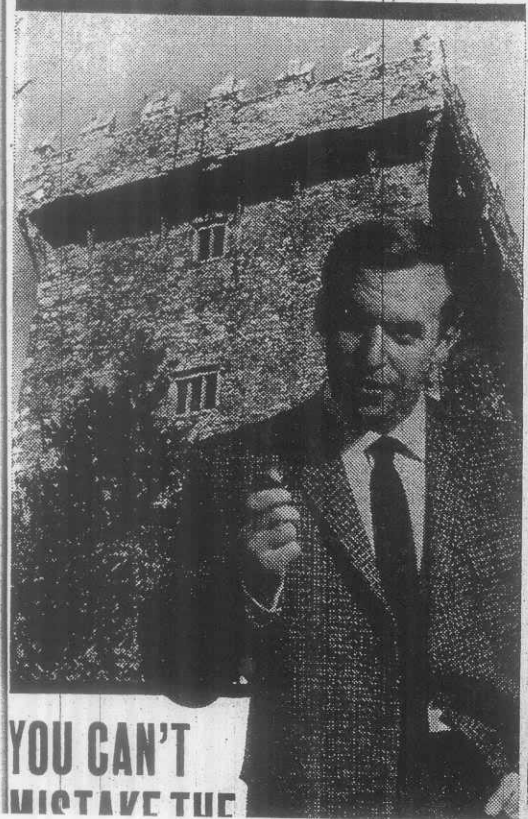

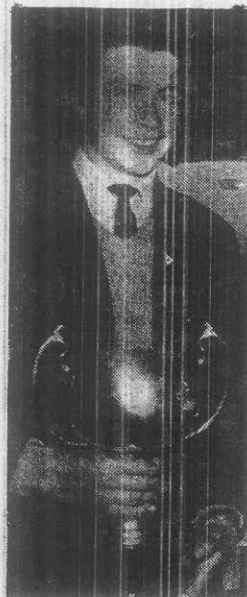

IT AGAIN

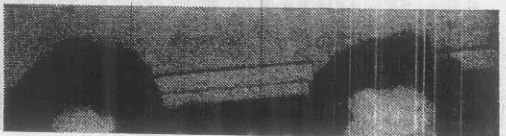
