Trad Time musicians take to the stage

OVER 100 young musicians will be taking part in a gala concert in the Lime Tree Theatre on Saturday, May 17. And while the concert is primarily designed to showcase the musical talent of some 125 young people, it will also help raise funds for St Ita's Hospital in Newcastle West and St Camillus's in Limerick.

The concert is being run by Trad Time, the Comhaltas Ceoltóirí Schools outreach programme, in associaiton with Limerick City of Culture and the Cathaoirleach of Limerick County Council, John Sheahan.

The event will also see the launch of the outreach programme's new brand name Trad Time.

Trad Time is an initiative that promotes the teaching and understanding of traditional Irish music, song and dance in primary schools around the country and has been up and running for the past two years. It now has a base in some 80 schools nationwide.

But the take-up in schools in Limerick city and county has been exceptional and some 28 schools are now signed up.

This involves young tutors

coming into the schools to teach the children traditional music, singing and dance.

The results will be there for all to hear at the Lime Tree on May 17 where a feast of entertainment is promised. Joining the young musicians will be some of the finest musicians and tutors employed by Trad Time who will also perform on the night.

Tickets for the concert cost €15 but a booking fee of €1 applies for on-line booking www.limetreetheatre.ie/ The Lime Tree Theatre is located in Mary Immaculate College. The concert begins at 8pm.

Damien's solo album

LIMERICK is twinning with the American Mid-West in a new collaboration for local musician Nick Carswell.

The Limerick multiinstrumentalist has teamed up with three top notch US musicians in his adopted home for the last three years of Kansas, forming Carswell & Hope, who are gearing up to release debut album titled A Hunger.

The quartet will tour Ireland in late July, with gigs in Dolan's Warehouse and the Greyhound Bar in Kilkee on an exciting agenda.

Nick tells us: "I'm very

excited to get back and play a tour, especially our big show in Dolan's.

"The biggest part for me is getting to bring my US bandmates back home, to meet everyone and see some of the great pubs, venues and scenery, from Clonakilty to Kilkee.

"It's that old thing of seeing your familiar and favourite places through the eyes of a visitor. The Carswell & Hope boys won't believe how amazing my home town and the West of Ireland is."

We have heard an early cut of the new record, which is due for release later this month, and can confirm that it builds on the beautiful, melody-driven tunes that were prevalent on Carswell's debut The Word, recorded with the Elective Orchestra and released in 2011.

Beefed up with the expert musicianship of Jason Slote, Austin Quick and Dan Hines and Carswell's superb songsmith abilities, A Hunger combines vintage rock, big harmonies and carefully crafted textures. Watch this space.
