AN EXHIBITION marking Limerick's proud dancehall heritage will launch in Limerick city this Saturday.

Are You Dancing? - Remembering Limerick's Dancehalls is a two week exhibition in the Stella Ballroom will feature photographs and other memorabilia from Limerick's dancing past, spanning from the late 1950s right up to the showband era of the

Showband star Tommy Drennan along with the editor of Limerick's Rock'n'Roll Club publication The Golden Era of Irish Showbands, Paddy Brennan, will launch the exhibition and organisers have promised a host of unforgettable stories will be recounted throughout the day.

Locals who frequented 'dances' have contributed personal photographs taken at such iconic city locations as Todsie's, The Stella, Jetland and Cruises Hotel along with a host of others will be on display for the duration.

Exhibition organising manager David Studer explained that visitors to the exhibition will virtually relive the special atmosphere of those days before entering the ballroom at the Stella.

As visitors pass the boxoffice the mumble from a busy ballroom has been faithfully recreated by sound engineers and as they move closer to the ballroom entrance the busy sound of a full room will get progressively louder.

stage during those heady days, including the Johnny McMahon and Bud Clancy Orchestras and stars like

Tommy Drennan. Mr Studer expressed his thanks to the Bird family for allowing them the use of the Stella to host the exhibition.

The highlight of the twoweek event will be a dance day on Sunday June 22, from 2.30-5.30pm at a specially constructed marquee complete with dance floor at St John's Square.

This free family event will feature music from The Kadillacs with Bryan Meehan of the Monarchs headlining and who will be joined at the concert by Margaret Ring and Michael Shortt, plus Tommy Drennan, Denis Allen and Shaun O'Dowd, "During the dances, the boys used to sit on one side and the girls on the other and someone would ask: 'Are you dancing?'
