

Casey Black is the Nashville born, Columbia University educated, gravel voiced, literary singer-songwriting son of Charlie Black, NSAI Hall of Fame songwriter of more than a dozen Number One country hits. Casey wrote his first song at 12 years of age. He signed with EMI Music Publishing Nashville at 19,

making him one of the youngest staff songwriters on Music Row.

Casey recently returned to Tennessee, where he lives with his wife in a small country house outside of Nashville.

He met Mick Flannery in the US and Mick asked Casey to open for him on his last Irish tour. Mick brought out his latest album in May2014 and once again, asked Casey to be special guest on all his Irish dates.


Casey Black has toured Ireland five times in recent years, much of it in the company of Mick Flannery. They first met when Mick was playing in Nashville. "We realised we were kindred spirits and Nashville can get a little weird for people such as ourselves."

Much like Flannery, Casey Black's music, he ventures is, "not fun or happy. It's not dance music. It requires someone to sit still and be open to it." He has many kind words to say about Irish audiences who have welcomed him here.

"When you open up for Mick Flannery you are already getting an audience who is already willing to wade out into the darkness a little bit, to listen to the lyrics and what you are saying. They are a lot more willing to, sort of, meet you in the middle and sort of rip their chest open and say 'here's my heart, it's seen worse'."

For the upcoming gig Casey will feature a mix of "rediscovered old-ness and some music I'll be releasing in the future." His new album, due for release in 2015, will bear the title 'See The Black Sea'
