New publishing deal for The Cranberries' back catalogue

THE lucrative back catalogue belonging to Cranberries' songwriters Noel Hogan and Dolores O'Riordan is to move to the Warner/Chappell Music UK publishing group, it has been announced.

Dolores and Noel have signed a publishing partnership with the UK arm of Warner's global music publishing company, home to Paolo Nutini, London Grammar, Muse and more.

The deal covers a more than 10-year body of work that includes mega-selling albums Everybody Else Is Doing It, So Why Can't We? and No Need To Argue.

The agreement covers the period between 1993-2004 – the Cranberries' most fruitful, with five multi-million selling albums - up to 40 million in sales - and includes the publishing rights to monster hits such as Linger, Zombie and Dreams.

Richard Manners, managing director of Warner/Chappell UK said late last week that the company was "delighted to provide a home for the works of Dolores and Noel, and I am especially happy to be reunited with their amazing music having signed the band's original publishing deal at the start
