ROCK DUO GAMAK TAKE TO THE STAGE IN DOLAN'S WAREHOUSE FOR A RARE SHOW THIS SATURDAY

TEN years since the release of seminal album *We Are The Way* forward and six years since going their separate ways, Limerick rockers Givemannah will perform on a local stage for the just second time since 2008.

The duo - Steve Ryan and Keith Lawler - have reunited for a series of one off shows to mark the tenth anniversary of the release of the album, the second of three critically acclaimed albums released in a fertile seven year period that preceded their amicable split.

The album was noted for its sweeping lush assault on the senses - in the very best of ways - and garnered a cult status. It will be re-released on Limerick label Out On A Limb to mark the occasion.

The two-piece - bone-fide members of Limerick's rock royalty, famed for their wall of sound style and frantic pace - have played just once, at their birthday party for OOH, and will take to the Dolan's Warehouse stage this Saturday night for a much anticipated show.

LIMERICK Jazz Festival returns this week with a top line-up of acts coming to the city for a host of gigs.

The festival, spearheaded by John Daly of Limerick Jazz Society, will take place across a number of city venues including Dolan's the Sassy Hotel, 89 O'Connell Street and Ormiston House, from Friday to Sunday.

Don McLean comes to the UCH for show

A MERE handful of tickets remain on sale for the first of two shows by American icon Don McLean in Limerick this month.

A smattering of tickets are left for the American Pie singer's show in the UCH this Wednesday night, with the follow up show on September 29 already sold out. The follow-up released a new live in Manchester DVD/CD recently, which features lost footage from a Manchester gig in October 1991 and includes classics such as American Pie, Vincent and Cryin'.
